Remarks on board of Ship Majestic Wednesday February 10th

The fore part fresh breezes from the SE and pleasant steering per compass at with fore topmast standing sail set nothing in sight the wind continues the same throughout the day with an occasional squall of rain steering since 7 Am N by E

gained a day by crossing the meridian

comes in with squally weather and strong breezes from the SE steering S N E variously employed the latter part the weather more moderate and pleasant. broke out slopes
so ends

Lat 27° 39' Long 180° 00'

Remarks Thursday February 11th

comes in with moderate breezes from the ESE and passing clouds steering till 4 Pm N N E then hauld to NE by E the remainder of the day on the wind on the Starboard tack the being to the Eastward blowing fresh

Remarks on board of Ship Majestic Friday February 12th

The fore part fresh breezes from the Eastward on the wind on the Starboard tack with all sail set at 2 Am Tacked Ship and at 6 Am Tacked again took out Beef and Pork employed on sawing wood

Lat 25° 17' Long 178° 55' W

Remarks Saturday February 13th

comes in with strong breezes from the Eastward heading most of the time N N E with the flying jib in at 4 Pm saw a breach the latter part the wind increased to a gale under double reef topsails

Lat 23° 48' no observation

Remarks Sunday February 14th

These 24 hours comes in with light gales from the Eastward accompanied with squalls of rain on the wind on the Starboard tack at 2 Pm took in the bow boat at 4 Pm shook the reefs out of the topsails and set the fore and main topgallant sails the wind continuing the same at 7 Pm the yebolt that held the main brace started from the davit whilst Cap M was leaning against it which threw him into the boat and cut his head slightly at 9 Pm Tacked Ship took in the topgallant sails a short time afterwards hauled
