Remarks on board of Ship Majestic Thursday March 4th

Fine breeze and pleasant weather steaming N. with topmast and topgallant standing sails at 4 Pm finished repairing the topsail and sent it up forward the latter part fresh breezes from the Westward on the wind heading N the hands variously employed

Remarks Friday March 5th

Came in with fresh breezes from the N.W. employed on rattling down the main rigging the middle part baffling winds with heavy showers of rain the latter part the wind more steady from the N.W. on the wind with all hands employed on rattling the main rigging

Remarks Saturday March 6th

Moderate breezes from the Westward and southerly steaming N by W nothing in sight the middle and latter parts the wind building on the wind heading most of the time N.N.E broke out water

Remarks on board of Ship Majestic Sunday March 7th

Fresh breezes from the N.W. with light passing showers variously employed the middle part light and baffling winds accompanied with rain the latter part dark threatening with nothing occurring of importance

Remarks Monday March 8th

Light and variable winds with heavy rains with poor prospects of getting North light baffling winds from the N.W. the latter part employed on rattling the fore rigging so early this day broke out Beef Wall Port

Remarks Tuesday March 9th

Came in pleasant with light breezes from the N.W. employed on rattling down masts no sails to 6 Pm saw blackfish toward the boat but without success the latter part fine pleasant breezes from the N.E heading N.W. employed on fitting new eyebolts in the fore trussbars
