Remarks on board of Ship *Majestic* Wednesday March 10th

Pleasant breezes from the N.E. heading N.W. employed in mending the cold fore topsail and setting up the fore topmast rigging the latter part the weather continues the same employed much the same as per Day

Lat 34° 54' Long 169° 36' West

Remarks Thursday March 11th

Light pleasant breezes from N.E. heading N.W. employed on the rigging mending sails and so the remainder of the day the wind and weather continues the same employed much the same so ends this day

Remarks Friday March 12th

Light breezes from the N.E. variously employed on rigging sails &c the wind and weather continues the same throughout the day all hands employed on the rigging and sails so ends

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Remarks on board of Ship *Majestic* Saturday March 13th

This day comes in with pleasant breezes from the N.E. on the wind heading N.W. employed on the rigging and sails latter part much the same at 8 Am the breakfast for the Starboard watch was taken forward soon after one of the watch Charles Gilbert came aft with the meat saying there was not enough Capt. M. told him to take it forward which said Gilbert refused leaving it in the galley at 10 past 1 Mr. Mitchell went forward and called them on deck they said they would not come till they had their breakfast he then called them again they then came up and asked Capt. M. if they could have more meat when Capt. M. replied that he meant that should have enough or words to that effect stating that he thought that 8 barrels per month was sufficient they then went to work

Remarks Sunday March 14th

Pleasant breezes from the Eastward steering N. with topmast and topallant standing sails set employed on sails and rigging the latter part much the same nothing in sight
