Remarks on board of Ship *Majestic* Saturday March 27th

Strong breezes from the S E heading N employed on mending the fore topgallant sail Mr. Tucker continued the same. The wind continued the same with cloudy weather and squalls of rain at 7 Am bent the fore topgallant sail. the remainder of the day variously employed

Remarks Sunday March 28th

Came in with moderate breezes from the S E steering per compass N by W employed on the rigging and otherwise at 11 Am broke out Sugar and Apples the rest of the day fine pleasant breezes from the S E steering N by W

Lat 20.34 N Long 112.21 W

Remarks Monday March 29th

Pleasant breezes and fair weather steering N by W with topgallant standing sail set Mr. Tucker is better employed the latter part on the rigging the weather continued the same

Lat 22.11 N Long 113.26 W

Remarks on board of Ship *Majestic* Tuesday March 30th

Pleasant breezes from the S E steering N by W all sail set employed much the same as usual the latter part the wind more to the Eastward employed on drying potatoes

Lat 24.38 N Long 114.48 W

Remarks Wednesday March 31st

Fresh breezes from the Eastward steering per compass N W employed on fixing three pendants and taking care of the potatoes the middle and latter parts light breezes from the S E employed on drying the potatoes at 7 Am broke out Beef and Pork

Lat 26.48 N Long 115.26 W

Remarks Thursday April 1st

Came in with light breezes from the S E steering per compass N by W employed on taking care of the potatoes the latter part calm at 7 Am went the foresail the remainder of the day employed on mending it
