Remarks on board of Ship *Majestic* Friday April 2nd

Calm employed on repairing the foresail at 4
Pm rebent it a light breeze from the Westward
the course being N N W the middle and latter
parts light breezes from the S W at 7 Am
sent down the main topgallantsail preparatory
to mending

Remarks Saturday April 3rd

The first of these 24 hours light and baffling
winds from the Westward broke out water
finished repairing the topgallantsail and at
5 Pm rebent it the middle part the wind
light and baffling the latter part light breezes
from the N E employed on painting the boats
on the house so ends this day

Remarks Sunday April 4th

Light and pleasant breezes from the S E steering
per compass N N W variously employed the middle
part wind continues the same gradually veering to
the W the latter part pleasant breezes from the
Westward steering N W with every thing set
save a forebuck

Remarks on board of Ship *Majestic* Monday April 5th

Fine breezes from the Westward steering N N W
at 2 Pm hauled for blackfish but without
success the wind continues the same through
out the day the latter part thick fog so ends

Remarks Tuesday April 6th

Moderate breezes from the S W steering
N N W by N and foggy wither variously
employed at 3 Pm broke out clear at 4 Pm
the wind suddenly hauled to the N N W
bringing the ship aback and carrying away
the topmast standing sail boom took in the
standing sails and royal on the round heading
W by N at 3 Am the wind hauled to the
Southward all day foggy

Remarks Wednesday April 7th

Came in with strong breezes from the S W
steering per compass N N W at 11 Am took in
the topgallantsails flying jib and furled the mizzen
top sail employed on splicing the standing sail
boom at 1 Am the wind hauled to the N N W
at 3 Am took in the jib mainsail and foretop sail
at 7 Am more moderate set the foresail of foretop sail
jib and mizzen topsail broke out reef and Park
