Remarks on board Ship *Register* of New Bedford Tuesday June 22nd

This day comes in with strong breezes from the ESE on the wind on both tacks with double reef topsails and courses 4 sails in sight. the weather thick or foggy at 6 Am gained with the *Tybee* of Stonington she had taken one steamer at 10 parted company at 11 Am set whole topsails and flying jib

Remarks Wednesday June 23rd

Comes in with moderate breezes from the Eastward under whole topsails and flying jib several sails in sight. the weather the middle and latter parts the wind light at 3 Am saw ice tacked ship all the latter part scattering ice in sight on both tacks employed on making a guister rail or spronkey rail

Remarks Thursday June 24th

Light breezes from the Eastward. all sail set on both tacks. scattering ice in sight also several ships. the weather thick. at 3 Am saw a finback toward the starboard bow and bow boats but did not fasten the latter part thick fog employed on the monkey rail. at 10 Am broke out water so ends this day

Remarks on board Ship *Register* of New Bedford Friday June 25th

These 24 hours. comes in with light breezes from the ESE. and foggy weather. on both tacks with all sail set. saw scattering ice. at 1 Am broke out Beef and Pork. the middle and latter parts the weather calm and more clear. at 10 Am saw land bearing North. employed on the rail so ends this day

Remarks Saturday June 26th

The fore part calm. Land in sight to the Northward and scattering ice. also a French ship. at 1 Am finished the rail at 4 Am a light breeze sprung up from the Westward on the wind on both tacks all sail set variously employed

Lat 64th 13 Long 174th 51Remarks Sunday June 27th

Comes in with fresh breezes from the Westward. on the wind on both tacks all sail set. the weather at times thick. the land in sight from NNE to NE. 2 sails in sight at 3 Am saw a bow head toward 4 boats but did not see him afterwards. at 5 broke out Fibers. at 6 Am took in the royal and topgallant sails the middle part calm at 4 Am a light breeze sprung up from the Southward at 10 Am gained with the *Conigo* of Fair Haven so ends
