Remarks on board of Ship Magister Sunday July 4th

Strong breezes from the S.W. at 2 P.m. kept off
N by N under double reefed topsails at 7 P.m. dropped
anchor under point Chaplain in company with 6
other ships the remainder of the day the wind
continues the same but foggy nothing of importance

Remarks Monday July 5th

Moderate breezes but foggy the wind being
S.E. lying at anchor at 1 P.m. kept the light
of the Green Man of Bedford at 8 P.m. back M
I came aboard thick fog the remainder of the
day at 4 A.m. broke out water the ship gaining
a head supposed to have been started in the ice
taking half hour spells to free her night and morning

Remarks Tuesday July 6th

~~was in with~~ moderate breezes from the S.E.
and foggy nothing of importance occurring the
middle part the wind and weather continues the
same the latter part the weather pleasant at
8 A.m. got under weigh and stood out for sea
at 10 toward Fox Island diggers but without
success at 12 M came in thick fog and
strong breezes

Strong breezes from the S.W. and thick fog?
on both tacks under double reefed topsails
at 3 P.m. the fog cleared up saw 3 boats
hailed aback and took them up under the
other boats they belonged to the Tiber of
Stonington. having lost the Bk in attempting
to go aboard from the shore at 4 P.m. the
fog cleared up heading in to the land saw
a ship at anchor to the windward at 7 P.m.
fog set in again. backed ship off and on 2
ablers at 10 A.m. broke out Bow Port and Broad
the wind heavy under double reefed topsails and courses

Remarks Thursday July 8th

Strong breezes from the S.W. and thick
fog under double reefed topsails and courses
on both tacks at 2 P.m. the fog cleared
up, 5 sails in sight at anchor 3 miles to the
windward. ran in and dropped anchor at 4 P.m.
the Tiber's boats then left us and pulled for the
ships. from 7 P.m. to 8 A.m. the wind light
and the weather pleasant at 8 the wind and
starboard boats went in shore the wind
the remainder of the day strong

Remarks Friday July 9th

Strong breezes from the ~~S.W.~~ ~~thwart~~
tripled the anchor for ice. and came too again
a few moments afterwards. at 5 P.m. the boats
came aboard at the same time the wind
moderated. the Starboard boat had seen a bow head
at 8 A.m. weighed anchor and stood in to the
land at 9 A.m. dropped anchor under bow head
Island so ends this day
