Commences with moderate wind from the sea steering se by e with all sail broke out for water at 10 Pm wind hauled to the se heading e by n

Commences with moderate wind from the se heading e by n with all sail later part the same same ends this day

Remarks Friday September 17th
Commences with moderate wind from the se heading e by n half n at 4 Pm furl'd topgallin sails and flying jib at half past 4 Pm under 2 reef top sails and ends with strong wind

Remarks Saturday September 18th
Commences with strong wind from the se heading e by n under 2 reef top sails at 4 Pm moderates 5 Pm under hock top sails at 10 Pm under all sail ends calm sail mending sent down the fore top sail and bent another

Remarks Sunday September 19th
Commences with calm heading in beach tacks broke out procession at 4 Pm light wind from the new steering se with all sail at 5 Pm set fore topmast and fore studding sail

Commences with moderate wind from the new steering se with all sail at 10 Pm strong wind at 4 Pm took in topmast studding sail sou ends

Commences with strong wind from the new steering se with all sail at 3 Pm furl'd main roy'l and misen topgallin sail at 6 Pm wind hauled to the n took in fore studding sail at 2 Pm wind hauled to the n ends the same

Remarks Wednesday September 22nd
Commences with strong wind from the ne steering se at 2 Pm wind hauled to the e heading se by s with fog at 1 Pm cleared up and moderates Ship sprung a leak pumping 3 hours out of 24 ends moderate

Remarks Thursday September 23rd
Commences with light wind from the e heading se then veered to the se the to the e wind baffling ship looking bad shows out of 24 at 5 Pm steering se mid night the same at 11 Pm wind to the s heading w by n saw porpoise struck one and lost his end pleasant

Remarks Friday September 24th
Commences with moderate wind from the s heading w by n at 1 Pm veered ship heading se sail mending and blacksmithing at 1 Pm misen wind se with rain and squally veered ship heading to the s tack in topgallin sails and flying jib and 2 the top sails at 5 Pm close reef fore and main top sail and furl'd the misen hand the main sail and jib with strong gale from the se with heavy squalls steering se ends the same
