

Remarks on board ship Majestic Thursday October 14th

comes in with light wind from the ESE heading
S land 10 miles distant saw 2 sail at 10 PM we
ship to the NE at 2 AM tacked ship heading to
the southward later part squally and baffling
with rain squalls saw mollyky and mokie
and wahoo

Friday

Remarks Friday October 15th
Commences with light wind from the E
steering from S to W by S wind fresh at 2 PM
steering up the land at half past 6 PM
left to off diamond head bent the chains
Saw 12 sail middle and latter part pleasant
laying of and on saw ends

Remarks Saturday October 16th
comes in pleasant with light wind from the E
laying of and on for a pilot at 10 PM
pilot came on board and the steamer took
us in to Honolulu at 2 PM came to anchor
in Honolulu took in the Sallard boat
later part braking out oil saw ends
in port

Remarks Sunday October 17th
comes in pleasant hauling ship hauled
along side of the Golden Eagle at 6 PM
later part all hands ashore but 5

Remarks Monday October 18th
Fore part men on shore later part
discharging oil and bone oil 2268 gals
bone 882 lbs

Remarks Tuesday October 19th
comes in pleasant nothing doing & later part
hoopering empty barrels saw ends

Remarks on board ship Majestic Wednesday October 20th

comes in with plenty of work hauled ship and m
rd ship later part sent ashore 30 empty bbls
and braking out provisions saw ends

Remarks Thursday Oct 21th
hoopering provisions and stowing down
later part broke out bread and flour and
stod it in the messen hatch

Remarks Friday October 22th
stowing down provisions in the messen hatch
and put on board the Golden Eagle 14
bbls of slush later part stowing away
shocks in the main hatch saw ends

at 4 AM Put one man in irons at 6 PM let him out
Remarks Saturday October 23th
stowing down casks and brakin out oil from
the main hatch later part stowing down
in riprack oil in the ground tier 1089 gals

Remarks Sunday October 24th
commences with stowing down empty casks
and sent one raft of casks on the reef
latter part men ashore

Remarks Monday October 25th
First part men ashore on liberty
later part men forward and in the stowage
went ashore to the consul and then to the
at 5 PM

Remarks Tuesday October 26th
First part discharged six men of them
was boat there got one raft of water 576 bbls
and sent in another saw ends with put
ting one man in irons

Remarks Wednesday October 27th
got one raft of water 576 bbls and broke out
shocks from the fore hold later part
taking our anchors let one man out of irons
