

Remarks on board Bark majestic Wednesday May 23rd 1860

Came in with light wind from the East steering all with all sail at 1 P.M. hauled to the wind heading at 1 P.M. 30 mts saw the land ahead ^{White rock & Harland} at 3 P.M. under ship to the eastward and southward saw sail middle and later part calm and fog

Lat 42° 24' Long 40° 24'

Remarks Thursday May 24th

Came in with light wind and baffling saw hump back at 4 P.M. and lord 4 boats came on board at 6 P.M. got nothing middle and later part light wind and calm seawards

Lat 40° 30' Long 42° 54'

Remarks Friday May 25th

Came in with light wind and baffling from all point of the compass at 7 P.M. came in with the Starthaff S. H. middle and later part calm and baffling wind saw hump back and lord 2 boats starboard boat went on and mist at 9 P.M. came on board at 11 P.M. saw 3 sail saw the land distant 5 miles

Lat 40° 35' Long none

Remarks Saturday May 26th

Came in with light wind and calm saw upright whale at 7 P.M. and lord 4 boats came on board at 7 P.M. without suckseep middle and later part light wind and baffling heading on both tacks saw 5 sail

Lat none Long none

Remarks Sunday May 27th

Came in with light wind and baffling thick and hazy starboard boat went in to white rock came on board at 5 P.M. with light wind from the East steering South with all sail middle part the same at 7 P.M. came to the wind heading at 11 P.M. reefed the topsail foggy look out needed

Remarks on board Bark majestic Monday May 28th 1860

Came in with fog and rain from the East heading at 1 P.M. with reefed topsails at 2 P.M. under ship to the East middle and later part heading on both tacks with fog and rain

Lat none Long none

Remarks Tuesday May 29th

Came in with strong wind from the East heading on both tacks with reefed topsails middle part the same later part cleared up made all sail steering all later part winds light and baffling seawards for 24 hours

Lat 37° 44' Long 43° 45'

Remarks Wednesday May 30th

Came in with light and baffling winds heading on both tacks saw the land middle part steering S.E. with wind from the East later part steering from the East with all sail saw nothing seawards

Lat 37° 02' Long 42° 05'

Remarks Thursday May 31st

Came in with light and baffling winds from the westward steering different courses at 6 P.M. steering at East with all sail middle and later part the same seawards for 24 hours

Lat 40° 24' Long 42° 45' E

Remarks Friday June 1st 1860

Came in with light winds from the West steering at East with all sail at 7 P.M. steering at East I saw the land bearing distant 30 miles middle and later part light wind seawards

Lat 41° 00' Long 43° 30'

Remarks Saturday June 2nd

Came in with light winds from the West steering at East with all sail at 3 P.M. saw whale and lord 4 boats came on board at 5 P.M. with out suckseep shortens sail at 7 P.M. and lay back heading to S.E. wind veering to the East at 3 P.M. under ship to the East at 7 P.M. not steering at East with all sail seawards

Lat 41° 30' Long 43° 45' E
