

Departure R. on 13. 13. 1836

1836

On Thursday the 26 Day of May A. D. 1836. We weighed anchor and stood to sea from St. Redford with all fair but a brisk wind under double reef Top Sails at 12 O. Ck. Standing Land bore E. N. E. Distance 25. M. at 5 P. M. lost sight of the land At 6 P. M. took in Fore Top sail blowing a gale & the wind a head - No Lat nor Long to Day

Friday
May 28 These 2 last Days Stormy Weather and blowing Heavy from the N. E. at 7 P. M. Wind went moderate Course E. S. E. Some of the crew Sick

Saturday
May 29 Comd. With Light breeze accompanied with a E. heavy swell from N. N. W. Course E. S. E. Schock Reefs out Top Sails and set main Top Gallant Sails Middle & latter light winds saw 1st School of Black fish and Porpoises to land

Sunday
May 30 Comd. With Stormy Weather blowing a gale of Wind from E. N. E. at 9 1/2 A. M. took in Fore Top sail - Course by the Wind at 1/2 past 10 A. M. took in the Fore Sails blowing still Heavy from E. N. E. & a high Sea running

Monday
May 31 Comd. With Strong Wind - took in Fore Top Sails At 11 A. M. 4 more Ships and stood to the N. And E. at 12 turned our Reefs out each Top sail All hands employed in fitting the boats and c.

JUNE 1. 1836.

Tuesday
June 1 Comd. With light Winds from the Eastward all Hands employed in fitting boats at 2 P. M. Saw 3 or 4 Whales off our Stern 2 Miles off Boat not ready did not land Saw a full rigged Brig with top of Top mast standing to the N. E.
