 services of Portsmouth 23 days for Liverpool

 The E. took in main top Gallant Sails

 By the wind at 10 A.M. saw the
 ship showed down main and foreboard sails
 and struck on each took them along side rigged
 Tacks and hoisted them in. End of this 12th.

 by the wind headed S. at 4 P.M. Spoke ship
