1836

Thursday ^{June 24} Comm. With pleasant weather and winds from S. E. and Sun. Set shortened sail and - 25 One hefted to the wind. Saw two sails off our St. (Deceased at day light made all sail. Course S. N. E. spoke Merchant Ship Ferox of Thom-
-aston. For St. York. 25.4 light winds from S. W. Co. E. & S. Caught a Porpoise. Land in breaking out the main hole for water Canid away and fore top-
-sail yard. Sent yard and sail board and Com-
-piling a new yard. the Island of Peak Pico.
In light also two other off the horn Dis. 30. Mi.

Saturday ^{June 26} Begins with pleasant weather several sails in sight. Winds from S. N. W. Saw a ship a ship a head chasing from sharks. Saw a number of birds in sight. Cruising around the Islands for sperm Whales. Squared the yards and men down for Peak Pico at 10 A. M. hauled on the wind.

Sunday ^{June 27} Comm. With pleasant weather and light winds from S. E. at 4 A. M. Saw sperm sharks as the daylight showed 2 boats and pulled towards them. Supposed to be Grampases. Set shortened sail and stood off the land 12 (night) lashed ship and stood in.

Monday Begins with fine weather winds from S. W. Tuesday ^{June 28-29} Saw a ship and a bird standing to the S. E. (at 6 P. M. Reaped for sails along winds land in sight saw several ships chasing for Whales -

Wednesday Light winds from S. W. spoke ship Packet of June 29. At 10 A. M. we set short top sails and kept in Company with ship Packeted Wind High kept off and ran down to the E. of the Island of Fayal. This afternoon the Capt. seized 2 men in the region and flogged them for stealing money from the Carpenter he gave one 30 and the other 25 lashes. at 6 P. M. spoke ship Cardiac of St. London lashed together & stood in for the land. Lat. N. Long W.

Saturday ^{July 2} Comm. With light winds from the N. W. Sailed ship and stood to the Eastward. spoke ship Com. Decatur No Oil Several sails in sight. St. under 24. ho.

Sunday ^{July 3} Variable winds and pleasant at 6 A. M. spoke ship Parachute of St. Bedford 31 Days with 75 Tons. Spoke Oil latter part Calm sail ship.

Monday ^{July 4} Comm. With light & breezes from the S. at 4 P. M. spoke a French Whaling Bark 1/2 past 4 kept ship off and run down for St. Georges Island.

Tuesday ^{July 5} Moderate winds and pleasant at daylight run down for St. Georges Island at 9 P. M. in Toward down Starboard quarter and the Capt. went on shore to trade. at 6 P. M. Boat set a. agreed for Potatoes. Onions &c lashed and stood off the land.

Wednesday ^{July 6} At daylight made all sail and stood in for the Island to resume our trade run down in old Sailed about Main yard and the mate went on shore at 3 P. M. Some of the nobility came off to visit our ship at 4 went on shore we having got all our recruits on board. Missed one of our men a Portuguese belonging to this Island. Captain offered a reward but could not find him came on board and stood off. So ended there 24. Hours Peak Pico. Fayal. Thoms. & St. Georges in sight.

Thursday ^{July 7} Light winds and pleasant Course N. W. & S. Middle part wind from S. E. stood in for the S. part of Pico and a boat ashore for two men to make up our complement but did not get any bought a few Onions. Came on board & stood off.
