Friday With light winds Course S. E. W. all hands
 July 29 Employed in Rattling down rigging. So ends the day.
 Lat. N. Long. W.

Saturday Begins with winds very strong from the E. S. E.
 July 30 Course S. E. W. at 10 A. M. took in fore & main
 top gallant sail. hauled up the main sail here
 the log and found she was going 10 1/2 knots per hour.

Sunday With strong winds from the E. S. E. at
 July 31 Sun set. Calm & squally latter part. Rain
 Course S. E. W. here the log found 9 1/2 knots per hour.
 Lat. N. Long. W.

August 1836

Monday Begins with light winds from E. S. E. Course S.
 August 1 Saw a sail of our frigate standing to the S.
 Saw nothing worthy of remarking. More.
 Lat. N. Long. W.

Tuesday With light winds from E. S. E. Course S.
 August 2 B. Caught several Dolphin hands employed
 In ship duty. Log 6 1/2 at 10 A. M. average 5 1/4
 Lat. N. Long. W.

Wednesday All of these 24 to strong winds from S. E.
 August 3 Course S. E. W. Saw nothing. Log average 6 1/2.
 Lat. N. Long. W.

CAPE DE VERDS.

Thursday Begins with thick weather and strong winds from
 August 4 N. W. Eastward Course S. E. S. E. W. at 10 A. M. the
 man at the mast head. Cries Land O. off our starboard.
 Boat Distance 35 miles proved to be St. Antonio one
 of the Cape de Verdes latter part moderate. So ends.
 Lat. N. Long. W.

Friday With thick weather and strong winds from
 August 5 Eastward at 9 A. M. Saw a sail off our starboard.
 Quarter. Course S. E. W. average 5 1/4 knots
 Lat. N. Long. W.

Saturday With strong winds and pleasant weather Course S. E. E.
 August 6 Spoke ship Antonio of Sag Harbor 31 days.
 Bound round the Cape of Good Hope Indian Ocean
 A. Whaling. Stood in Co. then dark and parted.
 Lat. N. Long. W.

Sunday With strong winds and pleasant weather
 August 7 Saw the Island of Pico one of the Cape de
 Verdes kept ship off and stood for the Island run
 close into the land and hauled a black main yard &
 Chanda away our waste boat and the Capt went
 on shore to get 2 men and some provisions at St. John
 Set boat returned on board with 2 natives from
 the Island of a bright Copper color. Heard
 main lack and stood S. E. E. So ends this day.

Monday These 2 last days light winds from E. S. E. S. E. W.
 August 8 At 5 P. M. saw a sail standing on the track
 Lat. N. Long. W.

Tuesday With light winds middle part strong from
 August 9 S. N. Course S. Equally. Saw a sail at 10.
 Lat. N. Long. W.

Thursday First and middle part of this 20 ho. Calm latter
 August 11 Part equally with showers attended with thunder &
 lightning. Saw nothing worthy of note.
