Saturday Cont. with fresh winds from S. E. W. Course S. E. W.
Set the lower and topmast shroudsails. Middle
and latter part same hands employed in ship.

Sunday Sept 4 Cont. blowing heavy with rain both in shroudsails
At 10 A. M. could reef top sails latter part were
ship and stood S. E. W. Wind from S. W. & S.
blowing a Gale so this time then 24 hours &

seen any thing. Weather rough with rain. Stand by &
