PAYTA . PERU.

Wednesday (Contd.) With strong winds from the S.W. Course N.
 Dec. 7 At 11 A.M. Spoke a Spanish Ship bound into Callao
 At 2 P.M. Saw 2 more sails and a man of war
 Had a Brig under conveyance to Enda later 24 hours
 Lat. 7° 07' S. Long 81° 41' W.

Friday
 Dec 9 These last 2 days saw nothing worth remarking
 Spoke to day the English Whaling Vessel Shamrock
 of London 40 tons with 100 barrels of sperm oil
 then bound into Payta and from there on to Japan
 Lat. 5° 46' S. Long 81° 45' W.

Saturday (Contd.) With light breezes from S.W. Course N.N.E.
 Dec 10 For Payta and in company with the Shamrock at 8 A.M.
 Saw the land ahead and at 10 made Payta
 Head 2 points off the horn kept off and at 12
 noon came to an anchor in 11 fathoms water found no
 American ships in Port
 Lat. 5° 03' S. Long 81° 12' W.
