1837

Saturday Light Winds from S.W. Standing in shore saw a
 Sunday 28 Ship off our W. Beam and the Gang a head and a
 Ship in Star of us at 6 P.M. Tacked off and stood
 to the Westward. Saw nothing like Whales. End
 Lat. 0° 51' N. Long 90° 11' W.

Sunday 31 Fair Weather Saw plenty Ships and the Rocks
 Redondo employed in Steaming down the Rio San Juan
 Lat. 2° 28' N. Long 91° 07' W.

Feb 1837

Wednesday 1 (Cont. With Pleasant Weather and light Winds from
 Feb 11 at 6 A.M. Tacked Ship and stood in for
 Albemarle Island at 9 tacked off no speech today
 Lat. 3° 30' N. Long 91° 11' W.

Saturday 14 Strong Winds from S.W. at 2
 Feb 14 P.M. Saw land tacked off and took in top Gallant
 Sails and Fly at 6 Lat the Rocks to End 24
 Lat. 5° 3' S. Long 91° 11' W.

Sunday 15 (Cont. With Strong winds from the S. Steaming by
 Feb 15 On wind. At 11 Lat 11 P.M. tacked in shore
 and stood to the E. for Charles Island. Winds light
 Lat. 1° 00' S. Long 91° 31' W.

Tuesday 17 (Cont. With light winds from the S. Standing
 Feb 17 To the E. for South Head of Albemarle at day light
 sent 2 Boats ashore after Terrefine. Ship going
 off and on at 8 P.M. boats came on board had
 4 good sized Terrefine. We shortened Sail
 and stood off to the Westward by the wind
 Lat. 2° 58' N. Long 91° 07' W.

Wednesday 18 Pleasant. Winds light. Saw a Sp. Whale Carcass
 Feb 18 At 5 P.M. Saw a Sail off our bow. Standing
 to at 11 tacked to the E. beating up to Chas. Is.
 Lat. 1° 08' S. Long 91° 00' W.

Thursday 19 (Cont. Pleasant Standing to the S.E. at 10 A.
 Feb 19 M. Saw from the Mast 40 Canes & Bruchez off
 Weather Breezy at 11 A.M. Landed all the boats &
 gave Chas. to windward. pulled in 4 P.M.
 Could not come up with them at 5. Came on board
 At Sun Set Saw them off our Weather Guard
 Headed to the S.W. going quick. So ended this 24
 Lat. 1° 00' S. Long 91° 57' W.

Friday 20 First Gave off this 24 hours light winds from the
 Feb 20 S. latter part Strong winds. Saw Albemarle

Saturday 21 Points with light winds from the S. Standing to
 Feb 21 the Eastward Charles Island a head and small
 Island under our lee. Saw Black fish 10
 Lat. 1° 17' S. Long 92° 46' W.

Sunday 22 For these 3 last days. Saw 40 Canes & Whales a
 Feb 22 Plenty. Strong Winds & a head for us. trying to get
 up the Chas. Island. Standing to the S.W. at 6
 Tacked Ship and stood for the Island. So ended

Sunday 23 This 5 Last day. Strong winds and Squally
 Feb 23 Weather. Winds to day from the S.E. at day
 light Saw. Wood? Island off our lee bow and
 at 11 A.M. off our W. Quarter Standing to the E.
 At 3 P.M. Saw Chas. Island. beating At E.
 At 5 " " took in main Royal and fly Sails
 stood on the wind to the Southward. ended this 24
 Lat. 1° 28' S. Long 93° 41' W.

Monday 24 (Cont. With Winds Strong from the S. Standing
 Feb 24 On for Chas. Island at 11 P.M. Came to
 An Anchor at Black Black Point in 11 fathoms
 the S. point bearing N. N.E. 2 miles at
 1 P.M. sent noon Calas ashore for wood. found
 the Ship Goscor of Ben. Despine lying for repair
 6000 out with 120 7 Bats from air. Capt

Laid in this port 3 days. one days liberty
 getting wood and provisions and a few Terrefine
