1837

Thursday Sunday April 9, 1837 Then last 8 days light & strong winds from the E. saw no spruce larches and stood to the W. haws employed in ships duty then last 24 ho. strong winds from S.E. the standing to E. & W. at 8 A.M. took top gallant sails and at 11. strong board took 2 reef in the top sails at 1 P.M. took reef out top sails and set main top gallant sails. To End then 24 hours

Lat. 36.36 S. Long. 117. 11. 11

Friday Then last 9 days has been blowing hard from the E. Apr. 18. Bona in for the Coast of Peru & Chili now broad of the Coast. Just back of then 24 hours squally latter part strong winds blowing S.E. & S.W.

Lat. 19.40 S. Long. 126. 10. 11

Saturday Cont. With strong winds from E. Steering to the Apr. 19. S.E. with reef top sails, at 6 A.M. hauled on reef out top sails and set main top gallant sails at 11 A.M. came up squally took in main top gallant sails & double reef top sails 12 noon further Vibs. Sprinkled & main sail at 3 P.M. all sail in except close reef main top sail lying too blowing a heavy Gale of wind, at 6 set down fore & main top gallant yards at 7 set for sail with a reef in it.

Lat. 20.49 S. Long. 122. 05. 11

Sunday Cont. With Light winds at 10 A.M. came on blowing Apr. 20. steady from E. ship under double reef top sails at 11 Clouds kept main top sail and further the fore top sail and here too at 7 A.M. set for sail. Reef. midship part down at day light hauled in by haws up main spruce. To End

Lat. 21. 25 S. Long. 124. 02

Monday Cont. With Brisk winds lat. about 11.00 Apr. 21. Last night winds to days from the S.E. came S.E. employed in ships duty midship and latter part main sail.

Lat. 22.28 Long. 125. 17. 11

Saturday Cont. With Light winds and pleasant weather stand Apr. 22. day to the S.E. & S.W. employed in making rope at 6 P.M. put a main sail a. Calm. To End 24.

Lat. 23.22 S. Long. 124. 10. 11

Sunday Cont. With Brisk winds and pleasant at 8 sent aloft Apr. 23. Top gallant yards main all sail Co. E. winds from S.E.

Lat. 23.48 S. Long. 122. 40. 11

Sunday Then last 7 days strong winds employed in sailing Apr. 30. up rigging. making rope & last 24 hours brist winds from S.W. came E. & S. E. & S.E.

Lat. 25.28 S. Long. 114. 08. 11

May 1837

Monday Cont. With Light winds from S.W. latter part May 1. winds from S.W. steering E. by S. saw nothing

Lat. 25.19 S. Long. 111. 50. 11

Saturday Then last 6 days fresh breezes from the S.W. & S.W. May 6. With squally rain for several hours E. & S. then last 24 hours blowing heavy from the S.W. & squally Co. E. & S. at 4 A.M. wind increasing took in fore top sail at 6 set it again at 8 set on reef out main top sail. latter part same

Lat. 25.16 S. Long. 100. 28. 11

Sunday Cont. With Brisk winds from S.W. & S.W. May 7. And latter part came E. & S. E. To End 24.

Lat. 24.45 S. Long. 97. 50. 11

Monday Strong winds from the S.W. came E. & S. E. latter May 8. Just same & took in main top gallant sail & main reef

Lat. 34.12 S. Long. 95. 15. 11
