Wednesday June 31 Begins With light winds from S. & E. Standing to the Eastward at 11 A. M. latched to the W. in Comp. With Ship coming at 3 P. M. spoke her again Capt. Came on board and ret^d at 7. took in light sails &c
No. Lat. 10° Longitude 6 days

Thursday June 1

June 1837
Continued With strong winds from S. & E. Steering to the S. & E. at 10 A. M. saw a sail of the Japanese standing to the E. Cloudy. Still in S. with coming

Lat. 2 12 N. Long 84. 12 W.

Friday June 2 This last 48 hours blowing hard from the South. Still in Co with Ship coming. Causing for whaling. And said nothing worthy of note employed in Ship duty

Lat. 1. 01 N. Long 84. 09 W.

Saturday June 3 Brisk winds and pleasant weather standing to the East at 9 A. M. saw the main land a head. Ship coming of the beam at 11 A. M. Capt. went on board Conway at 1 P. M. saw a Brig ahead with S. & W. at 8 Capt. Ret^d saw no whaling to day

Lat. 0. 9 N. Long 84. 40 W.

Sunday June 4 Brisk winds from S. & W. saw land off the beam and a Brig standing to the E. latter part windy light

Lat. 0. 22 N. Long 85. 59 W.

Monday June 5 These last 3 days Brisk winds from the S. & E. causing for Spm Whales. saw nothing but fin back Whales and Dolphins. latter part cloudy with rain these last 20 hrs. Strong S. breeze from S. & E. standing to the S. & W. broke out for meat at 11 Squads of Rain took in light sails. And stood along to the S. & W. latter part to the S. & E. saw nothing to day worthy of note. So ends &c

Friday June 9 Begins With Brisk winds standing to the Westward at 9 A. M. latched to the Eastward at 10 A. M. saw a sail standing to the Eastward latter part cloudy. And being at 2 P. M. spoke the Chas. of London a Spm Whaler 10 m. out with 450. Bales Spm. Oil
Lat. 10. 5 N. Long. 82. 58. W.

Saturday June 10 Brisk winds and pleasant. Steering to the S. & E. at 10 A. M. & latter part strong winds. Sp. Chas. to windward. of W. he bound in there and the Chas. to the West

Lat. 1. 01 N. Long 81. 40 W.

Sunday June 11 Begins With strong winds from the S. & W. Steering to the E. at 7 A. M. saw Spm Whales of the beam. being 79 days since we saw the kind. Several but did not get any. Whales got gathered and went to windward at 4 P. M. saw a sail standing to the S. & W. did not speak. Her. saw down could not see. Sp. sails. So ends &c

Lat. 1. 33 N. Long 81. 00 W.

Monday June 12 This 2 last days light winds from the S. standing to the E. for in there. Causing. saw fin back Whales. there last 24 hrs light wind and cloudy weather saw nothing

Lat. 1. 13 N. Long 81. 21 W.

Tuesday June 13 Continued With light breezes at daylight this day saw land and the Island of Rio de la Platte of our weather bar distance 15 miles & A. M. latched to the Westward. at 5 P. M. saw a sail standing to the S. & W. also saw Hump back Whales a Buckle 6 latched and stood to the E. with light winds. So ends &c

Lat. 0. 40 N. Long 80. 50 W.

Wednesday June 14 Begins With light winds and pleasant close into the land and abreast the Spanish Port of Pelangon at 7 A. M. sent a boat ashore to see if we could get coconuts & water at 11 A. M. Ret^d spoke Ship Triton of St. Bedford bound here for 6000 lbs. stood in together and at 12 latched on chains at 2 P. M. came to anchor at 4 P. M. Triton had 1350 Bales Spm. Oil out 31 months late from Japan had lost a boat. causing
