Sunday - Comm. With Light Trades from S. & E. at 8 A.M.
 July 2 - Schooner and Store to the W. all Hands employed in
 Boiling at 11 A.M. Saw Spm. Whales. Covered all
 our Boats. Likewise the Ship Triton covered all, and
 gave chase at 3 P.M. came on board the
 Whale gone to windward, got none. So ended 24th

Monday - Begins with light trades at 10 A.M. tacked to the
 July 3 - S. & W. at 1 P.M. tacked to the E. in Co. with Triton
 Hands employed in Boiling at 3 P.M. finished and
 turned up at the Coaster. 22 Bbls. of blubber to the
 Ship Triton in agreement before the boat got fast. End.

 all Capt. came on board of us. 6 Shortland Sail and
 At 8 the Captains Rel^d on board the respective Ships

Monday - Light Winds and pleasant weather Standing to the
 July 10 - S. & E. Saw Blackfish and 4 Sails in sight at 10
 A.M. Delivered 10 Bbls Spm Oil up to the Ship Triton
 and Paid Mate Ship. The Standing to the Westward
 and we in shore. So ended 24 hours.

Friday - This is last day light trades. Saw nothing today
 July 14 - At 10 A.M. saw Ship Mobile to day, and Blackfish
 latter part with winds from S. & W. and cloudy

Monday - This is last day. Strong Winds from S. & E. Standing to the
 July 17 - W. Cruising for whales. Saw none but finbacks
 and Blackfish latter part Standing to the S. & E.

Tuesday - Comm. With Light Winds from S. & E. at day
 July 18 - Light Squally 2 Ships (in sight) to the Windward
 one a Boiling. Saw 1 Blackfish and finbacks

Wednesday - Light Winds and pleasant weather Standing
 July 19 - to the S. & W. at 10 A.M. saw a Sail of our
 Ship in beam Standing to the S. & W. So ended

Thursday - Comm. With Light Winds from S. & E. at 8 A.M.
 July 20 - Blackfish to the Windward Saw 2 Sails at 3 P.M.
 M. Spoke Ship Corinthian of St. Bedford 30 mo
 out with 2000 Bbls Spm Oil at 6. 2 more in sight

Friday - Strong Winds and Squally Standing to the S. & E.
 July 21 - Spoke Ship Corinthian of our weather at 1 P.M.
 Saw Spm. Whales covered all the boats and gave chase
 at 2 Boats came on board did not get any the whales
 gone to the leeward. at 3 P.M. covered away again and
 gave chase to them at 4 Mate boat got fast and
 killed the whale took him along side. the Capt.
 got fast to another whale and lost his line
 likewise 2 Harpoons & 1 Lance to end
