Sunday Light Winds from the W. Standing to the E. rather
(Aug. 27) Party Saw Swamp Backs. and the land at 1 P.M.
Left the Island of Roca de la Plata distance 20 miles. The
S. backed this land stood to the S. & the S. ended there Enho.

Sat. 2. 49. miles P. Long 80.50 Y.

Tuesday Bristly heads and pleasant. Steering to the E. Latter part
Aug. 29 (broadly) Saw the Island of R. A. L. Plate and the Main
Land bearing 4 P.E. Distance 21. Miles. also a Sail.

Wednesday (cont.) With light trades fr. N. & W. Cloudy Weather at
Aug. 30 9 A.M. sent a sail Standing E. Saw no Whales of any
kind. No latitude to day. So Ends this 24 hours

Thursday Cont. With Strong Winds from the S. & W. Standing to the
Aug 31 East wind at 10 A.M. Saw Spum Whales off Weatherford
At 4 P.M. we covered all our boats, and at 5 the Mate
got fast to a small whale at the line the Hopper stood
then he raised his flukes and threw the Boat the Captain
Came up and took his line and killed the whale. Mate came
On board, at dusk took the whale alongside. Shortens said
no one but had
