Sunday Begins with brisk winds. Cloudy. latter part winds
Sept. 3 Light winds and pleasant. Steady to the S.E. Saw
finbacks and Hump backs

Monday Cont. With light winds and pleasant weather.
Sept. 4 Steady to the S.E. Carpenter employed in
Repairing Gun. J. Boat at 2 P.M. saw a sail

Lat. 2.22 S. Long. 81.40 W.

Tuesday Ther. 24 hrs. Light winds from S.W. Comm.
Sept. 5 To the Eastward Carpenter employed in repair-
ing G. J. Boat saw 4 sails to day. Cruising

Lat. 3.30 S. Long. 82.39 W.

Wednesday Moderate winds. Steady to the Eastward
Sept. 6 At 7 A.M. taking ship to the Westward at 10
P.M. saw a ship. Cruising in a whale ship
To be a Bedford ship. latter part calm saw

Lat. 2.44 S. Long. 83.00 W.

Thursday Cont. With light winds and pleasant weather
Sept. 7 Steady to the S.E. took a ship and soon
to S.E. Spoke at 4 P.M. ship north of
St. Bedford. Hoisting a large whale. To end.

Lat. 3.00 S. Long. 83.10 W.

Friday Ther. last 12 days. Saw finback whales, also
Sept. 8 Hump backs. Blackfish & every thing but sperm
employed in ship duty. Ther. last 24 hours
Rough weather impeded in killing Blackfish
Got on the 16th

Lat. 5.40 S. Long. 85.49 W.

Blackfish made 3 barrels. Stowed down

Wednesday Cont. With light winds and squally at times from
Sept. 20 S. and E. moderate and latter part moderate
Travelling to the Eastward. Saw whale. Brackets in hand
Came up with them and found them to be finbacks
Lat. 5.33 S. No Long to Day

Thursday With 3 last day. Light and strong winds from
Sept. 21 S. and W. saw no sperm whales. Squally on the 21st
Strong cloudy on the 22nd 33rd With strong winds from
S. and latter part squally. Saw a Bone Shark
Lat. 6.37 S. Long. 85.34 W.

Friday Steady Cloudy and squally from S. and E. Steady
Sept. 24 To the S. and W. saw nothing worthy of note
Lat. 6.50 S. Long. 85.31 W.

Saturday Cont. With brisk winds from S.E. Squally weather
Sept. 25 Steady to the E. 10 A.M. saw a sail to the
Windward. Steady on same course at 4 P.M.
Spoke the same ship it proved to be the Barque
Charles of London 14 mo. out with 550 Bbls Sperm
Capt. came on board and at 7 P.M. on his ship

Lat. 6.22 S. Long. 84.20 W.

Sunday Strong winds (trades) from S. and E. Steady to the S.
Sept. 27 and S. and E. Cruising saw finbacks and 2 fish
To day lowered and got 4 Blackfish at 6 Shortened
Sail and backed to E. To the latitude to day. Long. 82.5

Saturday Commenced with light winds. Steady to S.W.
Sept. 30 Employed in killing Blackfish at 11 A.M.
Lowered away for more and got one at 3 P.M.
Barque Charles. Gun down and spoke to, have seen nothing

Lat. 6.26 S. Long. 82.50 W.

Oct. 1837

Sunday Cont. With light breezes (trades) Steady to the
Oct. 1 S. 13. Got to northward at 6 backed to the
E. saw 10 fish saw down shortened sail ends.
