Furber's Quarters Boat struck fish and the Starboard  
Quarters Boat took fish. White Boat got fish to the Capt.  
Whale and kept him till him, took them along side and  
Con. Cutting in 7 P.M. finished and made Fair  
Lat. 3.00 S Long 83.00 W.

Sunday Puffing Winds and Pleasant weather employed in boiling  
Mar 11 Saw Nothing worthy Note later fresh Steady

Monday Com. With light winds and Pleasant weather fish  
Mar 12 Fair Steady to the N. later fresh to the S. & E. all  
Hands employed in Boiling at 7 finished washed off deck  
Made 40 Bbls. So ends this day all well and hearty.

Thursday Begins with fresh winds from S. Standing to the  
Mar 15 S. and W. all hands employed in Steaming down  
In Main Hold 40 Bbls. Oil.

Lat. 1.45 S Long 82.42 W.

Saturday Com. With Light Breezes from S. and N. Steady  
Mar 17 The W. Saw. nothing worthy Note So ends -

Wednesday Begins with fresh winds Standing to the S. & E.  
Mar 20 fishy fresh lashed and Stead to S. E. got 2 Bbls.  
fish yesterday. later fresh Steady winds and pleasant

Saturday Fishy fresh of these 4 last days Light Breezes from  
Mar 24 S. Standing to the N. got 2 Bbls. fish to day later  
fresh fresh winds. Steady in to the East. So ends.

Thursday Fishy fresh of these last 5 days. Fresh winds and Pleasant  
Mar 29 weather Steady to the S. & E. and Saw 10 Sperm fish &c  
Nothing Occurred of importance employed in Ship's duty &c

Friday Com. With fresh winds and Pleasant weather Steady  
Mar 30 The S. & E. Middle fresh Cloudy at 1 P.M. Sperm  
Sperm Whales off the Bore. Landed all 3 Boats and the  
Starboard Quarters Boat struck a 30 Bbl Whale, at about  
noon high along side. Shortened Sail and laid with our  
Main yard aback all night.

Lat. 2.24 S Long 83.42 W.

Saturday Fishy fresh Breezing winds from S. Cloudy Calm  
Mar 31 All hands at Wash Light and Con. Cutting in at 11.  
A.M. finished and at 4 P.M. began to boil out  
latter fresh light 1 Breeze made all sail and stood N.

Sunday Com. With Light Breezes and Pleasant weather from  
Apr 1 S. & E. all hands employed in boiling at 1 P.M.  
finished lashed up 36 Bbls at 11. A.M. finished by  
S. cloud Sperm Whales to back to take along side lowered  
Down the S. & E. Boat and took our Harpoon from it  
Marked M. B. supposed to belong to S. Mobile - N.B.

Lat. 2.25 S Long 83.07 W. Ends

Tuesday Steady Last 40 h. Fresh winds from S. and E. Standing  
Apr 2 S. to S. & E. Saw 2 Sails off our lee Bore all hands  
employed in Steaming down in the fore Hold Oil. latter  
Saw Saw Bk. fish lashed and stood to the Eastward

Sunday Com. With 1 fresh wind from S. and E. Standing  
Apr 8 to the Eastward Middle fresh to the W. Saw 2  
Sails off the Bore light off and run down and  
sprink them. Wm & Eliza of St. Bedford 27 Mo. out  
with 1300 Bbls. and the Constitution of Charleston  
3 Mo. out with 1350 Bbls Sperm Oil. So ends this 24
