Thursday June 5 Days Light Trade and pleasant
 Can weather. Steaming to the S. and N. and S. & E. to day
 At 7 A. M. Saw a Ship off our Gun
 With two main Ga. aback. we soon stop and
 stood towards her at 10 A. M. spoke San-Jair
 Ship. Henry of Bartucket. Chas. Smalley 20 Dec.
 1200 1200 You are seen by Shortland Sai

Thursday 19th This last, 5 Aug. Light Wind, and some white Cloud
Cruising on and about the Line of Capricorn saw
nothing more than Gentacles, hands, snappers &c. in 3 days.

Wednesday June 28. Cont. With Irish Trades, and Cloudy, not seen after 10. Remark on account of Sickness, was attacked on the 20th ult. with the Rheumatism. Spoke Surgeon General of "Havre de Grop" 40 m with 1000 Bats, Sails, nothing more.

Thursday
Sun 29 Oct 84. M. Saw 3pm Whales off the bar. Squared
to the yards and stood for them and at 9 o'clock
3 boats and gave chase the Capt. Fox took and
the other 2 boats killed him and fastened him
Killed the whale and took him along side and began
to cut in. Sun set Cloud down and doubtless
the vessels and the main yard stand at anchor
Lat 20° 9' Long 82° 10' W

Friday M. Hazy Light Breeze. Finished Cutting in-
Sund, 30 Wm. wheat at 18. D. M. and began to Boil 10-
A. M. washed off decks and cleaned any Cutting falls
Praced forward main yard and stood to S.E.

Nov 30
Friday

Lat. 1. 48 N. Long. 174
I've anchored what seemed away and the Capt. got fast
held him and took him off on side and then let the
get him out in and began to sail. So ends -

Monday — July 1839 —
 July 2 (Sailed with Light Tenders and pleasant weather
 Standing to the S and E. at 6 P. M. finished
 Hoisting the 2 wharves made 150 Bats Eaten —

Tuesday (Cont.) with Rainy Weather and rather Cloudy at times through
July 3rd The day saw nothing worthy of note. The day spent
at the better of my sickness after being blind, although
much at present does so much pain in my limbs.

Wednesday Com. with light Trades from S. and E. first gust on
July 14 Steering to S. and E. taking gust tacked. Still and stood
to the E. wind 10ish. So ended this 24 Hours -

Friday Tighthead and Glass and weather standing E.S.W.
 July 6 Tighthead and stood to the E. Quay wharfed in
 Flaming down in the main hole 140 Bells & Keir

Monday Capt. With Light Breeze and Foggy weather latter
July 16 Past Cape Cod and ran Copying on and about
The line of ~~Coast~~ saw nothing this 10 days
But Gulls, Boats, &c

Wednesday Light Trades and Pleasant Weather Clearing
July 18 Ford T. Wholes Saw nothing but finch and shaly 80c
Sat. 1.08 G. Cong. 82.10 7c

Thursday Cont. With Light Winds and Squally Weather Steering
July 19th to the S and E. at 11 A.M. Waw. Spr. Whales of small
size bore ab. 11^{hr}. Covered all boats at 12 the Cardboard
Guards boat got fast with 2 Harpoons the Captain
Came up and resumed skimming, and at 3 P.M. took
The Whale along side and Comd Cutting him in -
Sun set did not finish. Lat. 1.45. S. Long 84.10 W

Friday Mr. Day again Light Bruges Call^d all hands and at
 July 20 11 A. M. Finished and began to boil. Made Hair
 and brad^d forward and stood S. W. to E. S. E.
 Sat 127 S. Bong. W.

Monday, Light trades and Pleasant, Standing to the West
July 13 at 9 A. M. finished Boiling turn up 70 Bbls.
at Sun Set, rufed Tops all Vat, 121 Bouths

Tuesday First Port Squally. Steering to the E. Middle
July 24 And latter part, light winds. night Shortened sail
