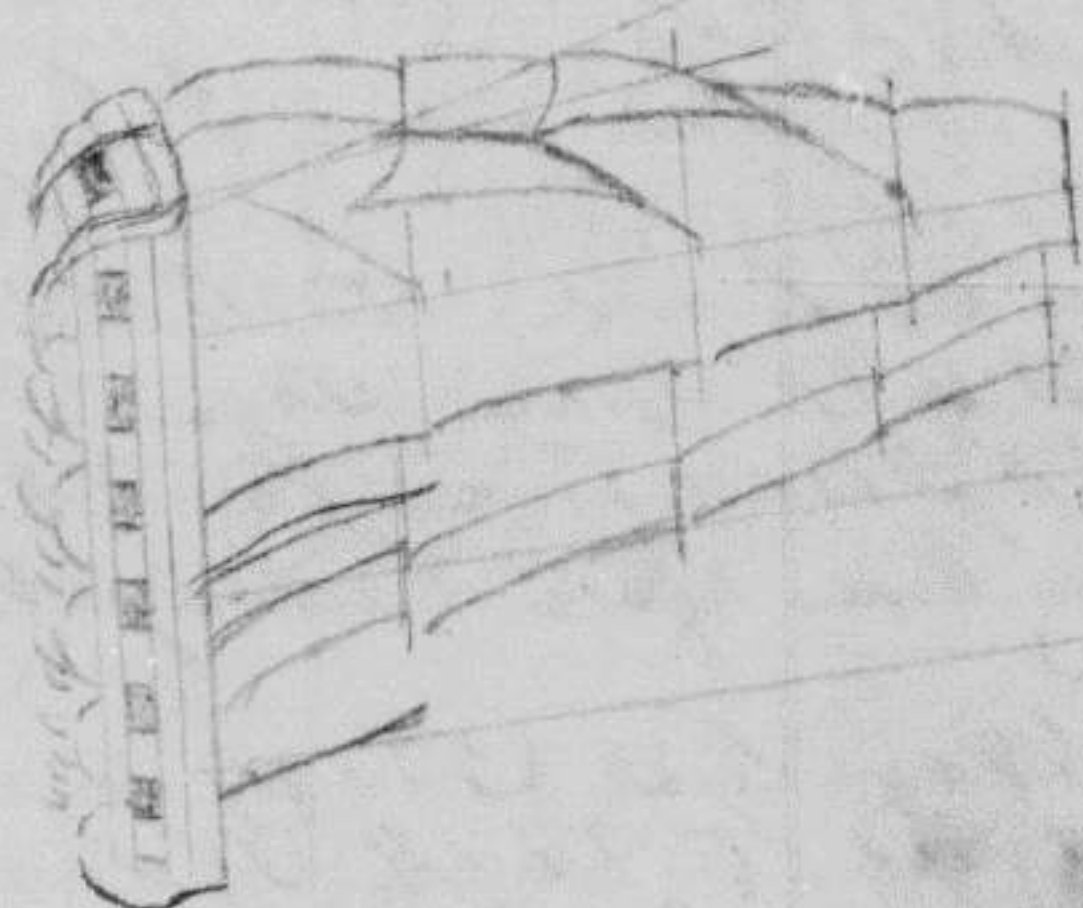

 Apr. 26 Standing on the road to the S. E. Saw nothing of
 any importance in Ships vicinity To End

Lat. 4.40 S. Long. 84.00 W

Friday Capt. With light trades and pleasant weather
 Apr. 26 Steaming a Course to the S. E. 5.00 M. on the
 night of the 24th spoke ship Wapoonag of London
 who did not understand how much we had

Lat. 1.34 S. Long. 85.27 W

Wednesday Capt. With Bish winds from S. E. Steaming in the
 Apr. 30 Spanish Port Alacambay being short of wood & water
 Saw nothing worthy of remark Scarcely last date To End

Lat. 0.58 mi. S. Long. 82.00 W

May 2^d 1839

May 9th Light Breezes and pleasant since last date
 Ground in to Alacambay at 12 noon came
 to an anchor in 7 fathom water Capt. &
 went on shore at Sun Set came aboard

May 8 Employed in getting off wood and
 water at 2 P.M. Bark Anna of
 Bristol Arrived Capt. Richmond last
 from Otahaiti with 1000 Tons of
 Oil came for wood & water. &c &c

May 15 at 4 P.M. we weighed anchor and
 proceeded to sea with a light breeze at
 Sun Set shortened sail &c &c
