

1839
 Sunday Weighed Anchor at 12 noon and dropped down the river
 June 16 About 5 M. below the City and then go out anchor
 to Peru side, got under way again at 6 and dropped
 down further on the morning of the 17th saw the entrance
 of the River on Tuesday 18 at 9 was in the Gulf or
 Bay of Peru again and in sight of Peru Island at
 12 high tide came to anchor again to wait for
 tide at 4 A.M. we got under way and left our
 Pilot and stood out with a fair wind - So

Wednesday Comd. with light Breezes, trying to beat out
 June 19 by the Island of St. John at 10 A.M. came
 to anchor and tide ahead at 12 got
 under way and made all sail and stood out by
 the Island. Latter part wind came so ended -

Thursday Began with moderate winds. Standing out by
 June 20 the land at 12 noon we made sail and about
 4 P.M. spoke a French Schooner
 (Mar. Court) bound into Guayaquil & thence
 from Cincinnati. Very a good number of fishers

Friday Began with light trades and pleasant weather
 June 21 We standing on the wind to the S.W. at 5 P.M.
 squared the yards. Comd. H. D. M. So ended -

Sunday Comd. with Breeze Trades, Starting H. D. M. at 9
 June 22 A.M. Braced the yards and luffed to the wind
 then set Shortened Sail. So ended this 24th
 Lat 2.30 S. Long 87.10 W.

Tuesday Light trades from S.E. Starting by the wind to the
 June 23 S.W. at 14 P.M. luffed and stood to the E. Latter
 part Cloudy and Squalls of rain
 Lat 2.17 S. Long 87.10 W.

Wednesday Began with light trades. Starting by the wind to the
 June 24 S.W. midday and latter part wind. Morning fresh
 at 6 took in top Gallies and O. reefed top Sails
 Morning heavy by Squalls with some rain. Ends -
 Lat 2.05 S. Long 87.10 W.

 Thursday Light Breezes and pleasant. Made all sail at daylight
 June 27 At 7 A.M. saw Sp. Whales a breaching off ship. At
 9 A.M. luffed Ship and stood for West at 9 A.M.
 At 10 lowered 3 Boats and pulled for them &
 the windward at 10 the boat Boat got fast to a
 small one the other boat kept on Chase till 10 then
 came on board at 11 took the boys boat to haul alongside
 and began to Cut him in. And T. Sail. So ended -

Friday Light trades. Standing on the wind to the S. all hands
 June 28 Employed in Roping. at 3 P.M. finished made 20
 Bils. 10 each of 200 and at 6 Shortened Sail

Thursday Began with light trades and pleasant weather
 July 1 Mopping with the top. note employed in making Spun yarn
 Standing by the wind to the S.W. So ended - 2nd 16
 Lat 2.17 S. Long 86.10 W.

Saturday Comd. with light Breezes Standing to the S.E. at 6
 July 6 A.M. saw Charles Island of our long distant 20 M.
 At 11 saw Wood's Island and at 2 P.M. saw Sp. Whales
 4 M. off. 12 points of Sea. Long 3 Boats
 And gave Chase. Could not get to them. Came on
 Board at 5 P.M. found that the whales had gone
 to the windward. Luffed Ship and stood to the N.

Sunday Light Breezes and pleasant weather. Standing
 July 8 in sight of the Islands. Chas. & Wood. Saw
 Working working note. So ended -
 Lat 1.30 S. Long 91.10 W.

Tuesday Light trades and Squalls with rain. till 9 Chase
 July 9 Spray. Employed in mending old Sails at 12
 12 saw Sp. Whales off the beam & the long. 1-20
 Lowered 3 Boats and gave Chase. After having
 a hard trial to come up with in Chas. on board
 with now the School divided and went to leeward
 Chas. and Wood. Islands in sight. also Chatham. So
