Monday <sup>Com.</sup> With Strong Winds and Squalls of rain -  
 Aug 15 Employed in mending sails. Standing by the wind to  
 the E. at 1 P.M. Saw 3pm. Whales off our lee bow  
 stood along for them and at 2 P.M. the lowered boats  
 and pulled for them after some time the S.P. boat  
 got fast to a 30 Bl. whale soon after they got fast the  
 whale sounded and the line parted and took him the  
 first went to the leeward, all the boat on Chate at 3  
 P.M. the whale turned to windward and the boy boat  
 got fast to a large Cow whale the other boats kept on  
 Chate after the school till 5 then came on board took  
 the whale along side at Sun set double reefed main  
 topsail and blew up fore top sail and let it hang  
 with fore yard aback. Capt. took 1/3 of his line -  
 1-06

Thursday <sup>Ad.</sup> daylight Call all hands and <sup>Com.</sup> Call in  
 Aug 16 to a light at 12 finished and come to bed made  
 sail and wore ship & stood to the West saw set  
 came on blowing S. Rags topsails. So Ends -

Friday <sup>Com.</sup> With Strong trades employed in boiling -  
 Aug 17 At 4 P.M. finished mending sails. Made sail  
 when topsails & topgallant sails, washed of decks -  
 Lat. 4.27 E. Long 92.02 W

Saturday <sup>Strong</sup> trades and Cloudy Standing to the W. Saw a  
 Aug 18 number of fish off at 6 P.M. Saw a sail off our  
 W. bow standing to the E. lashed ship and stood  
 to the E. latter part Wind same or rather moderate

Sunday <sup>Moderate</sup> Trades Standing by the Wind to the E -  
 Aug 19 Saw a sail off W. bow standing same saw a  
 Sun set. Saw Camber sail all night. So Ends -

Monday <sup>Trish</sup> Winds. Standing by the wind to the E at 6 -  
 Aug 20 A.M. Saw a sail off our lee bow standing -  
 an same course we lashed and stood to the W.

Wednesday <sup>Moderate</sup> Winds and pleasant weather employed  
 Aug 21 In Storing down air in the upper hold latter part  
 wind same, at 4 lashed off. So Ends. then when  
 yesterday was employed in breaking out and storing  
 down. With wind light saw nothing of note -

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Monday <sup>Com.</sup> With Strong Winds and Cloudy weather Standing  
 Aug 26 To West. saw 1 N.E. Saw finback Porpoises &  
 This last 4 days same wind and weather. To finishing  
 Lat. 3.35 E. Long 87.40 W

## September O. D. 1839

Sunday <sup>Com.</sup> With Strong trades and Cloudy weather  
 Sept 1 Standing to the W. Saw a sail at 2 P.M. the  
 standing to the W. at 6 lashed fore top sail in sail  
 Lat. 3.15 E. Long 89.15 W

Monday <sup>Com.</sup> With Strong Winds and Squalls Standing  
 Sept 2 To the S.W. at Sun set saw 3pm. Whales off our  
 the beam lashed away two 1 boat and pulled to the  
 leeward but did not see the whales. Dark came on  
 & board and D.R. topsails and fore top sail & main  
 sail were ship and stood to the E. So Ends -  
 Lat. 3.15 E. Long 89.00 W

Tuesday <sup>Strong</sup> Trades and Cloudy weather Standing  
 Sept 3 To the S. and W. Squally weather at 7 this day  
 A.M. Tacked and stood S.W. latter part same  
 Lat. 2.17 E. Long 90.05 W

Wednesday <sup>Com.</sup> With Strong Trades. Squally weather  
 Sept 4 Wore ship this morning and stood to the S.W.  
 middle and latter part wind same. So Ends  
 hands employed in ship duty mending sails &c

Thursday <sup>Trish</sup> Winds. With Strong trades. Squally weather  
 Sept 5 And latter part same lashed at 7 A.M. and  
 stood to the S.W. Saw finback Whales &c  
 Lat. 7.45 E. Long 90.00 W

Friday <sup>Trish</sup> Winds. With Strong Trades. Squally weather  
 Sept 6 To the S.W. at 7 A.M. lashed and stood to  
 the S.W. lashed to repair 5 P.M.  
 Rant it again at 6. Double reefed topsails  
 and fore top sail  
 Lat. 8.30 E. Long 89.40 W
