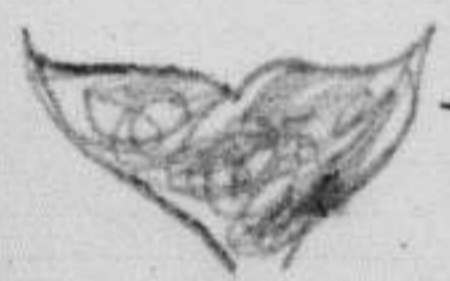
Thursday Comd With Light breeze standing in to the S. E.
 Oct 30 For the Cape all day light sail off our W. -
 Bone stood along side saw small point on head
 a high mountain. kept ship by a light at
 10 P.M. was inside the Point toward a
 May the S. in Port and the Capt went on
 Shore after the Mail (Mr. Howland) at 5 P.
 They came on board and stood off for a few
 Miles & found Ship Augustal & Clarish -
 latter repairing a leak & was square in yards and
 stood to the N. took in fore & main top & sail

Thursday Irish heads Co. to the S. W. employed in ship
 Oct 31 Put at 12 noon land Spent 20 miles off low
 Bay and a head going to windward at 1 P.M.
 3 Boats were pulled to windward at 2
 P.M. Bone Boats succeeded in getting fast
 took the whale head & head back some 200 paces
 - by immediate top after they fattened by the
 line getting to point, kept Chalks fire and
 the line got all had a short tow by the Stone
 whale. How up and we got the line in it -
 place again. The waist boat fattened to
 another whale and the line got ahead of the
 Bone boats and was forced to cut the line.
 Boat quick to the windward gave chalk till
 3 they came on board took the whale. Alonson
 had come to cut the man at the mast head
 reported a large whale off low beam toward
 again and gave chalk. found that he was
 going so quick gave up land and on board
 finished up boats. Saw another whale
 after going quick the line covered again -
 But could not get on. Could not land
 Double Rap & Captain laid with fore & -
 back

 12 saw a sail standing to the S. E. and set we
 started to S. E. by Imple in boiling sea

 Nov 2 Imple in boiling to 10 AM finished washed
 off made 38 Bats 6 sheeted sail to end

Friday Comd With strong winds steering by the wind
 Nov 5 on both tacke fish to the S. E. saw nothing
 since 1st day with remarkable success in skin
 Out Carpenter employed in repairing boat &c -

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Thursday Irish heads Co. to the S. W. employed in ship
 Nov 7 Standing by the wind to the S. E. light breeze employed
 in getting up the oil in the S. E. had all ground
 standing by the wind to the S. E. took to the E.
 and caught a small one. top & all work pack stay
 back on both tacke. saw no more - so

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Friday Standing by the wind to the E. light breeze employed
 Nov 8 in getting up the oil in the S. E. Sphering top & -
 a stay & saw nothing worthy of note at end -

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Saturday Standing to the E. sent another man to the
 Nov 9 A M. saw four whales off low beam to the
 10 miles off at 2 P.M. took toward 3 Boats
 and gave chase after some time saw one
 that got fast and the school went quick
 to the windward killed the whale and took him
 a long piece at 5 P.M. prepared for cutting took
 down light sails and I. huped up sails & laid forth
 and for go aback to cut the 2nd row
