 the ship's side to be a whaling boat
 packed one load towards West. W. saw her
 10.00 m. down Chas. W. Whales at 12.00
 General 3 boats and pulled to wind the
 Whales appeared to be galled their boats gave
 up the chase and our ship on at last the
 Barbours Gr. boat succeeded in getting first
 the other two boats pulled up and followed
 to the same one at 4 P.M. we had him
 close side took in light sail. Closed down
 and D. rapid topsail. Bird had got away
 Galle just squall rain saw a sail to windward

E. wind up sail at 12 noon we finished
Baling made 70 bbls. Coopers and we
bushell off. are wind to West.

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Saturday I begin with strong breezes for the S. S.
Jan 10 Employed in towing down six or eight Hops called
Hark, wind strong and a heavy S. S. rain -
Sat. 5-10. S. S. Long W.

Monday Light Wind and Pleasant. Middle post
 Sailed by a heavy sea, rather cloudy. Course to
 100 by the wind employed the Steaming Oil in the
 fore hold 11 1/2. It was tackled to the E. Spoke the
 ship. This ship of 1000 tons, 13 m. 8 1/2. Bells
 sent another ship to the windward. The tunnel to the
 Isaac Montland of N. Bedford. 6 PM we started
 sail. Ship off Foul be before the land. De.

Thursday 21st Wind Moderate Saw 2 Ships one off the
Steam one off W. bond both standing N. E.
Supposed to be the Duke and Isaac H.

W. Edwards, Light & Breezes Comm. to the E. all Sail Sat
 Aug 12 AM 6 AM Van 3 Vails one off each 100
 And one off W. Quarter of both Light of one
 And saw another astern standing long as
 AM 2 PM. Saw a large whale off our
 Marked bow eye hauled a back and landed
 3 Boats in a short time the bow boat got
 On and hove 2 Harpoons in him. The other boats
 came up and fished also took him along side
 Can 5 took him on & him, bow side head by
 At back the Ship's Mastern proved to be the Specter
 The Cann came up with us and the Capt. came on board
 This was the largest sperm whale I ever saw
 45 feet long. Lat 4. Long 111. W.

Thursday Strong wind and a heavy swell of sea
Saw 23 porpoises cutting at 5 1/2 P.M. we finished
Made Tails and began to sail
