Thursday Com. Blowing fresh fr. S.E. at 10 a.m. Sat
 Mar 26th wind came W.S. Co. N.E. 11 a.m. Sat
 Steadily sails set. Men did work. Came up a
 heavy squall. Carried away fore topmast
 and after Steadily sails set. Up S. Mast
 along with clear and dry. In P.M. 4th square
 increasing to a gale. Close reef. Main topmast
 failed. (Square yards). No ob. to day
 Friday 27th wind strong fair. Carpenter &
 employed in getting topmast. 4 P.M. sent a
 large topmast. put rigging. course. Sunday
 No ob. to day

Saturday Strong winds & cold. Employed in setting
 Mar 28th up to topmast & for. Hired rigging
 Co. E. W. E. & P.M. sent a light topmast yard
 5 feet topmast. 11th & 12th topmast
 7 wind increasing. A. R. P. to sail. Latter
 part took in fore & main topmasts. Ship before
 the wind
 Lat 46.32 Long 50.30 W

Sunday Had strong winds and a heavy sea. Sun
 Mar 31st bath date. Wind fair. Nothing. Keen of note
 Yesterday Lat was 45.32 Long 47.39 Lat 43.15 Long 44.10

Monday Com. with strong winds. At N.E. 12 the
 Apr 2nd wind shifted to S.E. 6 P.M. had a
 tremendous head sea. A steerman took ashore
 a most shocking accident. He was foramed
 since the ship took a sea over his head
 which washed him against the mainmast along in the water
 so bruised & cut by a lance it is feared it
 will prove mortal. The cut was in the
 back as his trousers saved off the wound & blood
 him below

Friday Light Breeze from last date wind ahead mist
 Apr 16th time on the 9th in Lat. P.M. saw a whale or
 toward 2. Birds found they were a going to fish
 Came on board again. Hatteran Spack wind came
 3 P.M. saw a ship of the line standing on
 Jan. Co. Lat 20.19 S Long 32.37

Saturday Wind Light 7 A.M. Lat 3. Royals 2 P.M.
 17 spoke ship Howard of Nantucket for
 The King Mills Group. Supplied with bread
 Lat 19.18 S Long 31.17

Sunday Began with light breeze. Clouds
 Apr 21st N.E. by the wind saw a sail off W. Port
 Veandring. Name this afternoon. A quick
 alteration in the steamer who was engaged on
 the 3rd Inst. at 4th past 7 P.M. the departed
 this life. He was a native of Boston
 Had wife a mother & 2 sisters. Name John
 Goddard aged 34 years. Latter part wind came
 Lat 15.14 S Long 31.50 W

Thursday Com. with light winds. Co. N.E. at 7
 Apr 22nd A.M. Cloud up. Royals settled down
 Top & yards. Hauld up. Main sail & down
 1st Lib. laid fore topmast to the mast-house
 Volours 1/2 mast. Had prayers & turned the
 Dead 7/8 mast all sail and stood on our Co.
 8th passed 4 spoke French Brig Messina of
 Nantz for Trieste for Montevideo. Saw a
 sail of the line standing S.E.

Lat 13.31 S Long 30.12 W
