

Saturday Nov 16 1844
 Begins with fresh breezes with rain squalls
 from W. S. Steaming S. P. E. at 7 doubled reefed Lat 25 10 N
 the ship's latter part fine weather with fine
 breezes from W. S. Steaming S. P. E. with all sails
 employed in setting up rigging and so
 ends

Sunday Nov 17 1844
 Begins with fine weather light breezes from
 W. S. Steaming S. P. E. saw 1 sail heading
 to the N. W. crew employed in making
 harnesses middle and latter parts light
 and 1 brig in sight off the line gunner
 employed in muzzing main topmast yard
 and so ends

Monday Nov 18 1844
 Begins with light air from the
 S. and clear about for Steaming S. P. E.
 1 Brig in sight middle and latter
 part light breezes from E. S. P. E.
 Steaming on the wind to the southward
 sent up the signal and sent
 the sail set at the main topmast
 muzzing and so ends

Tuesday Nov 19
 Begins with fine breezes from E. S. P. E.
 the wind to the S. saw 1 sail
 Steaming to the N. W. employed in
 breaking out the main hatch for
 sails water and boards set the low boat
 on the crane middle part 1 brig breezes
 from S. P. E. by E. latter part wind
 E. S. P. E. employed in ships duty and
 porting 3 masted vessel and
 so ends

Wednesday Nov 20 1844
 Begins with brisk breezes from the
 E. S. P. E. Steaming in the wind to the S.
 saw 1 blackfish growing quick to the
 windward middle part wind E. S. P. E.
 Steaming S. P. E. and E. set the four top
 mast and main top gulland Steaming
 sails saw 1 sail Steaming S. P. E.
 employed in various jobs broke out
 for flour and so ends

Thursday Nov 21 1844
 Begins with brisk breezes from the E. S. P. E.
 hazy weather Steaming S. P. E. at 6 P. M.
 left her off 1 masted kept her up S. P. E.
 latter part the same employed in getting cutting
 gear and so ends

Friday Nov 22 1844
 Begins with brisk breezes from E. with
 smoky weather Steaming S. P. E. at 8 P. M.
 saw the island of Bona
 Steaming S. P. E. S. P. E.
 Bona was E. 12 miles
 distance off
 1 light P. breezes from
 E. S. P. E. 1 ship and
 2 barques in sight
 employed in setting up rigging at 1 P. M.
 broke breezes from E. latter part the same Lat 12 45 N
 employed in various jobs 3 masted vessel
 off duty and so ends

Saturday Nov 23 1844
 Begins with brisk breezes from the E. Steaming
 S. P. E. sent 1 ship and 1 masted vessel Lat 10 17
 1 brig in sight middle and latter part the same
 a brig middle and latter part the same saw Lat 23 12
 a long at head Steaming S. P. E. employed
 in setting up lower muzzing and so ends

Sunday Nov 24 1844
 Begins with light breezes from E. Steaming S. P. E.
 1 Brig ahead employed in breaking out for
 water middle and latter part the same Steaming Lat 22 50
 1 3 masted in duty and so ends

Monday Nov 25 1844
 Begins with light breezes from E. S. P. E.
 3 boats for blackfish got 1 cut in 2 sails Lat 7 20
 in sight middle and latter part light
 breezes from E. Steaming S. P. E. boiling and filling
 1 ship gear so ends

Tuesday Nov 26 1844
 Begins with light breezes from E. Steaming S. P. E.
 6 sails in sight finished by 10 at 2 P. M. Lat
 employed in various jobs latter part the same
 with again took on the sailing sails to gulland Lat
 sails and hauled the courses 7 ships in sight
 and so ends

Wednesday Nov 27 1844
 Begins with thick weather with warm wind
 from E. S. P. E. at 2 P. M. made all sail saw Lat 5 11
 2 sails middle part the same latter part the
 fine weather employed in various jobs 1 masted vessel
 in sight so ends
