

Wednesday April 16th 1845
At this 24 hours fine weather employed
in stowing down water I watched on liberty finished
stowing down the water the watch came
off at sundown wind

Thursday April 17th 1845
At this 24 hours fine weather sent on
shore to barrell of the four and mizen
regal mast & stowing such stores as were
shar I watched on liberty felt about 8 o'clock
the watches the watch came off at sundown
Alexander Adams occupied so ends

Friday April 18th 1845
At this 24 hours fine weather at day light
sent 3 boats for the water got it to
long side at 6 AM I watched at 10 AM
the boats got off 6 bells of work
retired stowed down the water with
men came off at sunset took Alexander
Adams out of the boat & Mr. Russell
and the Blacksmith of duty so ends

Saturday April 19th 1845
At this 24 hours fine weather shipped
3 gun 2 anchors 3 canisters employed
in clearing up decks commenced
heaving up the anchor took our
mower at 10 AM and went to sea so ends

Sunday April 20th 1845
Began with fine breezes starting
at 10 AM employed in stowing the anchors
at 12 PM fresh gale from from the N
& doubled voyaged the mizen at sunset
took in the jib and four and mizen
topsails shot masted the main top sail
were shot & the 8 & 6 was then lowered
at 3 PM was at 10 PM were shot
& the 8 & 6 at 9 PM were shot & took
the barbed rager in company with
captains on shore so ends

Monday April 21st 1845
Began with fresh gale from ESE
the ship laying off and on at sunset
The captain came off got to ground line
of the rager off her off to the South
of the island passed the rages out of
the rages set shelling sails bearing
N by E wind SE so ends
