

The Marcus Capt Taber

Monday Sept 3rd 1845
 Begins with heavy squalls of wind
 from the S.W. heading W.S. Lat 30-10
 W. kept on the job and doubled
 reef of the fore topsail in forenoon
 mending the fore main topsail
 daylight sent the main topsail and
 set the fore and main topsails main sail
 and fell with heavy squalls of wind
 and rain so ends

Tuesday Sept 4th 1845
 Begins with strong gale and squally
 from the S.W. heading S.E. Lat 29-54
 in all sail but the main topsail came
 on to blow in the night made no
 sail caught 1 gony so ends

Wednesday Sept 5th 1845
 Begins with a heavy gale from the
 S.E. heading S.W. made the sail Lat
 got to lower daylight set the fore
 and main topsails main sail and fell
 employed in mending launchworks
 and on the morning to ends

Thursday Sept 6th 1845
 Begins with light winds from the
 S.E. by E heading S.W. by W employed Lat 30-30
 in mending launch works and to work
 on the morning fine weather took in
 the fell and doubled reefed the
 topsails daylight made all sail saw
 porpoises so ends

Friday Sept 7th 1845
 Begins with fine weather but light
 winds from the E.S. heading Lat 31-19
 S.W. by E employed in over hauling
 the yards and shotlines saw porpoises Lat 36-57
 took to on with sail with water in the
 night daylight made all sail employed
 in getting the spar but saw porpoises
 so ends

Saturday Sept 8th 1845
 Begins with fine weather light winds
 from E. to E.S. heading S employed Lat 31-45
 in getting the spar but saw porpoises
 daylight made all sail and washed
 the decks saw black fish and porpoises
 washed employed in various jobs
 and so ends

Bound to Newland

Sunday Sept 9th 1845
 Begins with fine weather with calm
 employed in painting the boat over Lat 31-59
 had and various small jobs saw
 porpoises caught one fish daylight made Lat 177-02
 all sail saw porpoises and rollers
 found three bats but did not get
 fast so ends

Monday Sept 10th 1845
 Begins with light winds from the E.S.
 heading S came on to blow with Lat 32-44
 heavy squalls of wind and rain at
 half past four doubled reef the
 Lat 177-30
 fore sails and sundown took in all
 sail but the fore sail and close reef
 main and main topsails at 11 P.M.
 set the main topsail at 12 P.M.
 all night in heavy squalls saw
 black fish so ends

Tuesday Sept 11th 1845
 Begins with moderate gale from
 the E.S. heading S by W Lat 33-39
 four topsails the sea was employed in
 various small jobs took in all sail Lat 179-12
 daylight turned the masts out at 7 P.M.
 in tent the fore topsail to mend and
 so ends

Wednesday Sept 12th 1845
 Begins with light winds from the E.S.
 heading S.E. employed in mending Lat 35-26
 the fore topsail at 6 P.M. finished the
 fore topsail and sent it again saw Lat 175-08
 porpoises turned the reef out of the
 main topsail and set the main topsail
 carried all sail and stood round
 watches daylight called all hands
 and washed of decks saw porpoises
 and porpoises so ends

Thursday Sept 13th 1845
 Begins with calm at 8 P.M. sprung
 up a light breeze from the N Lat 34-16
 heading E.S. employed in various
 jobs came on to blow with squalls Lat 177-50
 of again daylight called all hands
 and washed of decks the black
 with employed to work at the
 foremast so ends
