Smith of Edgarton 16 Mo but 800 bls part Sperm
Middle and Latter part Moderate and pleasant
Saw the Land and 9 Ships. Likewise 1 Right
Whale going to windward to fast to lower for ha

Friday Jan 6th Continues light breeze from
the N.W. heading to the N.E. 4 PM gained
with the Almira again. Middle part Moder
breeze. Latter part fresh breeze at 4 AM Saw a
number of Humpbacks at 9 Spoke Ship Gov Tr
Wiley N.B. and Eliza Cornell of N.B. Nothing this
Season. Steering to the Eastward So Ends
