Sunday Jan 13th 1850. First part light air and calm with showers of rain. Middle part moderate breeze from N.W. Steering E. by E. Latter part fresh breeze Steering E. S. E. Cloudy hazy in

Saturday Jan 14th Continuing fresh breeze from the Westward. Steering E. S. E. Started 1st Boat 1st Lt of Pork yesterday. Middle and latter part strong breeze with squally with light shower of rain and hail. Steering E. S. E. by E. Caught a porpoise 50 miles.

Sat by Obs 47.11 S. Long by Obs 89.28 E
Sunday Jan 15th Strong breeze and squally from the Westward. Steering E. S. E. Middle and latter part much the same. Steering E. S. E. by E.
Sat by Obs 46.51 S. Long by Obs 93.49 E

Monday Jan 16th Commenced strong breeze from N.W. Steering E. S. E. the remainder of the 24 hours the same. No obs.

Tuesday Jan 17th Throughout the 24 hours strong breeze from the Westward and squally with Steering E. S. E. Caught a Porpoise. No obs.

Wednesday Jan 18th First part strong breeze from the Westward and rainy Steering E. S. E. Middle part squally at 1 P.M. while reeling the main top sail Isaac Clough fell from the main top on deck and broke his arm and otherwise bruised him the Capt splinted it up and bled him and he is doing well. Latter part fresh breeze Steering East. Nothing in sight worthy of remark.

J. A. Wild Master Towing New Zealand 1850

Thursday Feb 2^d 1850. Strong breeze from the N. and foggy Steering to the Eastward (sailed 1st Boat Middle and latter part moderate breeze foggy from the Northward heading to the Eastward Saw a Right Whale and lowered 3 Boats did not see him again.

Sat by Obs 47.30 S Long by Obs 105.21 E
Friday Feb 3^d Commenced with moderate breeze from the South and clear. S. B. 

Weather at 3 P.M. Saw 3 Right Whales lowered the 3 Boats Starboard Boat struck and killed at 4.30 took him to the ship and commenced cutting at 9.30 finished. Shortened sail the 1st Middle part light breeze at 5 A.M. Saw one whale but could not get fast. Latter part began hailing.

Sat by Obs 47.55 S Long by Obs 105.31 E
Saturday Feb 4th Continuing fine weather Employed in bailing at 3 P.M. Saw Whales and lowered at 4 P.M. Started Boat struck and killed at 5.30 took to the ship and commenced cutting took in throat and lips and lashed down for the night. Light breeze through the night at 5 A.M. commenced cutting at 9 A.M. finished Employed in bailing.

No obs.
Sunday Feb 4th First part Employed in clearing away the head and bailing. Saw Finback Whale and latter part strong gales and rain cooled down the works. Sat by Obs 47.59 S Long by Obs 105.50 E
