

Remarks on Board Ship Manufo of New Bedford

Monday Feb 5th Strong Gale & Rain, the first part of this day Middle part began to Boil. Latter part Strong breeze employed in Boiling

Lat 43° 51' Long 154° 10' E

Tuesday Feb 6th Strong breeze Middle and Latter part the same employed in Boiling

Lat 43° 17' 15" Long by Chron 153° 20' E

Wednesday Feb 7th Strong breeze first part of this day employed in boiling. Middle part finished. Latter part blowing down bit

Thursday Feb 8th Fresh breeze first part employed in blowing Middle and Latter parts the same Saw 3 or 4 Right Whale, lowered the boat and chased but could not get fast.

Friday Feb 9th Strong breeze and squalls saw Whales lowered for them could not come up with them. Middle and Latter part Strong breeze and rugged No Whales in sight to day

Lat by Chron 48° 11' S

Saturday Feb 10th Commenced with Strong breeze Middle part strong and raised 11 PM ship a heavy sea Spore the 43rd Boat slightly Latter part repairing the Stern beat. Saw Whales lowered the Boat waist

Boat struck and got 2 or 3 Strakes at direction both the Whale to the Ship and get ready for butting

Wednesday Feb 22nd 1830. First part fresh Gale from S.W. Steering E. by N. Middle part fresh breeze steering N. E. Latter part saw the Snary and one ship. Steering N. E. by S. Nothing more of note

Lat by Chron 47° 47' S Long by Chron 157° 10' E

Thursday Feb 23rd Continues fresh breeze from S.W. Steering N. E. Saw Stewart Island at 4 PM Spoke Ship Addison of N.B. Lawrence 40 Months 23 or 44 Whales b.c. Middle and Latter part light Westerly Windy Steering to the N. E. in company with the Addison the land in sight all along shore

Friday Feb 24th The wind and weather much the same Steering to the E. N. E. in company with the Addison Middle and Latter part much the same Saw a Spanish sail and a Pinback.

Lat by Chron 47° 01' S Long by Chron 170° 34' E

Saturday Feb 25th First part fresh breeze Steering N. E. N. E. in company with the Addison 4 PM Spoke Ship Rambler. Willis of N.B. did not ascertain how much b.c. Middle and Latter part Strong breeze Steering N. E. and North employed in cleaning and drying some

Lat by Chron 45° 10' S

Sunday Feb 26th First part fresh breeze from S.W. Steering N. N. W. at 3 PM saw the Spirit of God Middle and Latter part light breeze from S. E. Steering on for the Harbour at entrance of the Heads. So ends

Monday Feb 27th At 2 PM came to anchor in Akaroa Harbour in 6 fathoms water and lowered the Sail. Spent the place quite in the thing from what it was 24 years ago then there was no white inhabitants here now they are quite numerous we were visited by
