Remarks On Board of Ship *Marion* of New Bedford quite a number from the shore. Spent till of day at Port. Middle part calm latter part fine weather employed in drying bone &c.

Lying at anchor in Akroa Bay N. E. Tuesday Feb 28th. Fine weather the first part of this day employed in bundling bone. Middle part fine weather. Latter part fine weather employed in washing ship &c. Got some fresh Beef, Potatoes, Cabbages Turnips Carrots &c from the shore.

Lying at anchor in Akroa Bay Wednesday 29th. Fine weather the first part of this day put on bone 35 bundles weighing 33 23 lbs. on board of the Addison to be carried to New Bedford. Middle and latter part fine weather. Latter part Harbor Watch on Liberty. To End.

Lying at anchor in Akroa Bay Thursday March 1st. Fine weather. Subject the watch returned. Middle and latter part fine weather. Harbor Watch on Liberty.

Lying at anchor in Akroa Bay Friday March 2nd. Continues fine weather at sunset the watch returned. Middle and latter part fine weather. Watch employed in various jobs.

Lying at anchor in Akroa Bay Saturday March 3rd. From this time to the 12th. the regular routine of performance took place such as getting of water and stowing it away. Stowing down Lobbs of bit getting of Potatoes Cabbages Turnips Carrots &c. The Portuguese Boat Steerer and three foremast hand took a boat in the night and deserted from the ship in the morning saw the boat on the beach took her off land. Offered a reward for the deserters, the Police and others were on the look out for them but could get no trace of them, and on the 12th of the month took our anchor and left Akroa behind.

Tuesday March 13th. At Meridian took our anchor and put to sea in going out spoke the Ship *Ramblor* of New Bedford beating up the Bay. Middle part fresh breeze from the N. W. Steering to the Eastward. Latter part strong breeze Steering N. N. E. Stowed the Anchors &c. Left by Obs 43. 39 S. Long by Obs 175. 40 E.

Wednesday March 14th. First part the wind shifted in a Squall to the South and blew quite strong. Steered N. N. E. Middle and latter part moderate breezes from the Eastward Steering to the wind to the N. N. E. Stowed down the Chain.

Left by Obs 41. 50 S. Long by Obs 175. 18 E. Thursday March 15th. Continues moderate breezes from the Northward Steering to the Eastward. Middle and latter part light breeze from the Northward Steering to the Eastward. Nothing in sight. Watch variously employed.

Left by Obs 42. 10 S. Long by Obs 179. 15 E. Friday March 16th. Continues light breezes from the North Steering to the Eastward at 4 PM tacked to the Westward. Middle and latter part moderate breezy Steering to the Westward.

Left by Obs 41. 27 S. Long by Obs 176. 48 Saturday March 17th. Continues much the same. P. M. tacked to the Eastward. Middle and latter part moderate breezes from the same old quarter heading on different tack. Saw Porpoise and Finbacks.

Left by Obs 41. 25 S. Long by Obs 179. 28 Sunday March 18th. The same old story heading to the N. N. W. Middle and latter part much the same as the first Steering on different tack.

Left by Obs 41. 30 S. Long 179. 11 E.
