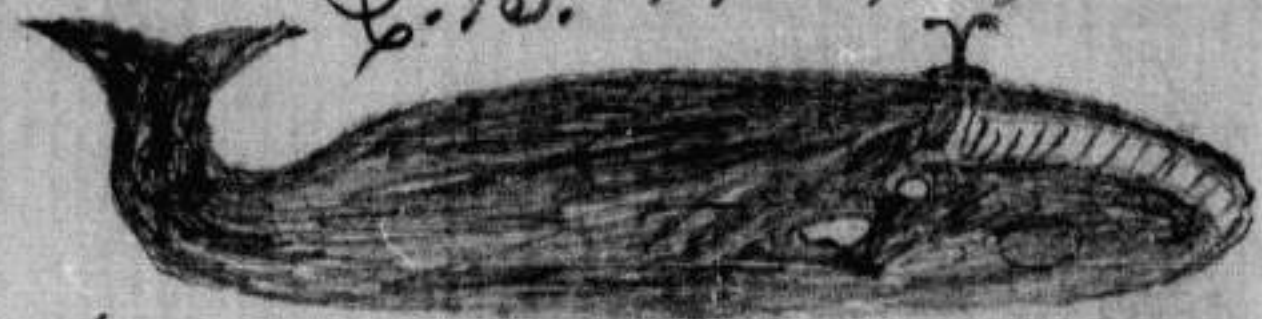


Remarks on Board of Ship *Mary* of New Bedford

Wednesday July 17th 1861. Continues foggy, lying
a back. Middle part the
same. Latter part moderate
breeze from N.E. & cloudy at
7 AM. Saw a R.W. 8.30 lowered
3 boats. Harbor Boat struck & killed at 11 AM.
took him to the ship & got ready for cutting. Cove
new cutting tally. Ends moderate & showery
Lat by Obs 44. 47 N



Thursday July 18th. The weather continues the
same. Employed in cutting & PM finished. Saw
the land 30 miles distance. Middle and latter
part moderate breeze and clear weather saw the
land. Employed in cleaning & drying bone

Lat Obs 44. 52 N. Long by Chron 138. 20 E

Friday July 19th. Continues moderate breezes
and clear weather. Saw Plenty Finbacks.
Middle and latter part light breeze daylight
commenced boiling 7 AM saw a R.W. he came
up close to the ship and the smoke galled him
lowered 3 boats & chased but it was no go.

Lat Obs 44. 50 N

Saturday July 20th. Continues light breezes
steering North employed in boiling & drying bone
saw Finbacks. Middle part steering N.E. finished
boiling. Latter part foggy. Ends light breezes

Sunday July 21st. First part light breeze &
hazy weather. Opened 1 bl of Beef & 2 bl of Pork.
Middle and latter part light breeze heading
to the Eastward. Saw Finbacks &c

Lat by Obs 44. 45 N.

Bound to the Ochotsk Sea

Henry Eldridge Master. Cruising in Japan Sea

Monday July 22nd 1861. First part light breeze
steering to the Eastward by the wind & PM saw
the land some islands to the south of the straits
on the Eastern shore. Middle part much the same
latter part moderate breeze from the Eastward heading
to the port toward the land in sight.

Lat 44. 25 N. Long by Chron 140. 31 E
Tuesday July 23rd. The wind & weather continues
the same. Middle part light breeze steering to the
N.E. day light saw a big latter part light breeze
steering to the E.S.E. saw the Island of Moneron
& the main land. So ends this day.

Wednesday July 24th. Commences fresh breezes
steering S.E. & S.E. at 3 PM passed the Island
broke out for a chest of J.C. Middle part calm
latter part moderate breeze steering S.E. at midnight
close to a rock in the straits marked on the chart
as dangerous & I should think it was. Saw a very
quantity of seals on it. Turn back & a Junk.

Lat 45. 45 N. Long 142. 20 E

Thursday July 25th. Continues moderate steering
to the Eastward. Land in sight on both sides of straits.
Middle and latter part moderate breeze from the
East a bit dead ahead beating through the straits.

Friday July 26th. Continues the same. Middle and
latter part moderate breeze steering by the wind
to the N.E. by N. Saw plenty of Finbacks. Ends cloudy

Saturday July 27th. Continues moderate breezes
& cloudy. Steering by the wind to the N.E. Middle
part the same. Latter part fresh breeze & cloudy
inclining to a rain. Ends the same.
