

Remarks on Board of Ship Murengo of New Bedford

Friday May 15th 1852. Commence light breeze and smoky weather. Middle and Latter part the same since old story. the Land, fish boats and Finbacks

Saturday May 17th. The weather about the same. Washed off the ship. Started one Reg of Thakadi Sugar. Middle part Moderate at 5 AM Capt Green of the Massachusetts came on board & had a Gam. Latter part Strong breeze from N. E. and Squally. Saw a Whale turn fluky. Land & White Rocks in sight

Sunday May 18th. Continuing Strong breeze and Squally heading to the Eastward. Middle and Latter part Moderate smoky, hazy weather. No Whales in sight. Land, Massachusetts in sight

Monday May 19th. Same Old Story. Middle and Latter part Moderate breeze and hazy weather. Steering to the S. E. and Nothing in sight

Tuesday May 20th. First part light breeze & foggy heading to the Southward. Middle and Latter part Moderate breeze & Cloudy. Inclining to rain. No Obs. Heading S. E.

Wednesday May 21st. Commence Moderate breeze and rain. Heading S. E. Middle part the same. Latter part clear & Pleasant. 5 AM saw Daggett Island and one strange sail. Ends fine weather. Lat by Obs 38.00 N

Thursday May 22nd. Continuing fine weather at 4 PM spoke the Massachusetts and turned N. W. opened 1 Bl of Beef. Middle and Latter part light breeze steering N. W. in com^{rs} any with the Massachusetts. Land & Finbacks in sight. Lat by Obs 39.11 N. Long by Obs 130.20

Henry Eldredge Master Cruising in Japan Sea

Friday May 23rd. The first part of this day light baffling windy. Steering N. W. Middle part the same. Latter part light breeze and foggy steering N. W.

Saturday May 24th. Continuing the same. Middle and Latter part fine clear weather & light air heading to the N. W. the Land & Massachusetts. Lat by Obs 40.20 N. Long by Obs 129.30 E.

Sunday May 25th. Fine weather & gentle breeze steering in for the Land at sunset luffed by the wind. Middle and Latter part light breeze and thick fog steering by the wind on different tack.

Monday May 26th. Commence foggy heading to E. S. E. Middle and Latter part fresh breeze & Squally took in sail and let her mull. Ends thick fog heading to the Eastward.

Tuesday May 27th. Fog to begin with. Middle and Latter part fine clear weather and light air steering N. W. for the Land which is in sight some distance off. Nothing in sight remarkable.

Wednesday May 28th. Continuing clear weather and light breeze heading N. W. Started 2 Bls of Beef. Middle part clear weather & AM saw R. W. & lowered 4 boats. it came on foggy. called the boats on board. Remains foggy the rest of this day.

Thursday May 29th. Fog to begin with saw R. W. turn fluky close to the ship. Middle and Latter part strong breeze and rain. heading various courses the Land in sight.

Friday May 30th. Commence strong breeze steering by the wind on different tack. Middle part the same. Latter part Moderate breeze and Cloudy trying to get to windward. the Land and Finbacks in sight.
