Saturday August 16th 1852 in Continues Foggy finish
steering oil about 500 lbs started 10th 10th 10th 10th
1st 1st 1st 1st Middle part the same latter part fresh breeze
and cloudy smoky weather. Employed in cutting

Sunday Aug 17th Continues strong breeze & very
saw N.W. lowered the boat 2 P.M. Caribbea Boat
Struck the whale run bad could not get fast in
another boat and at sunset cut the line and
came on board. Middle and latter part more
moderate steering various ways. Saw Finbacks

Monday Aug 18th Rather more moderate the first
part of this day steering various courses.
Middle part light breeze. 3 AM saw N.W. seeing
eye but did not lower. Ends Foggy heading W.

Tuesday Aug 19th Commences Foggy. Ammunition
hazy weather heading W. S. W. Saw Finbacks
Middle and latter part heading to N. E. Saw N.W.
9 C.C. lowered the boat Caribbea
Boat Struck and killed at
Meridian took him to the
Ship and made him fast.

Wednesday Aug 20th 2 P.M. commenced cutting
cut until 8 P.M. and lashed down for the night
Moderate through the night 6 AM commenced cut
again 8:30 finished. Saw for. Ends cloudy

Thursday Aug 21th Moderate & cloudy. Employed
boiling and setting up shocks. Middle and latter part
strong breeze from S.E. heading to the S.W. and steady
rain. Employed in boiling & setting up shocks
Rainy

Wherry, Edward, Master. Cruising Cohasset Sea.

Friday August 22nd 1852 in Continues strong breeze
and Rainy heading to the S.E. Under Short Sail. Boiling
middle part much Rain. Cooled down the works. Latter
part not so much rain 10:30 started the fires again
Ends to cloudy & Foggy.

Saturday Aug 23rd First part moderate breeze & Foggy
setting up shocks and boiling. Middle part the same
boiling. Latter part fine weather
and light breeze. Saw N.W. and
lowered 4 boats. 10:30 Caribbea
Boat Struck fast to the whale. at Meridian.



Sunday Aug 24th Continues fine weather and South breeze
at 3 P.M. took the whale to the ship & began to cut at 7 P.M.
looking sail & set the watch. Moderate through the night.
Latter part cloudy. Employed in cutting. Saw N.W.
Saw 4 boats 3 P.M. Spent 1st 1st 1st 1st

Monday Aug 25th Fine weather the first part at 3 P.M. commenced
cutting. cleared away the head and commenced boiling and
setting up shocks. Middle part light rain. Latter part foggy
Employed in boiling setting up shocks & lowering down oil
Fog & Fog

Tuesday Aug 26th Continues Foggy. boiling & lowering down
Middle and latter part fresh breeze & Foggy. boiling & lowering
Fog & Fog

Wednesday Aug 27th First part moderate breeze
and cloudy. Employed in setting up shocks and
boiling. Middle part head. Latter part Foggy. Employed
in lowering down oil. boiling and setting up shocks
Fog & Fog

Thursday Aug 28th Continues Foggy. lowering down
oil. 7 P.M. finished boiling. Middle part moderate
latter part fresh breeze & very strong employed
in breaking out and lowering down oil
Saw 4 boats 3 P.M.
