

Remarks On Board of Ship *Waver* of New Bedford
 Henry Eldredge Master Cruising the North Sea

Thursday Sept 11th 1862. Continues moderate breeze
 Saw R.W. lowered and chased. In P.M. Moderate through
 the night. Latter part fresh breeze. No Whales.

Latitude 47° 51' N. Long by Chron 149° 30' E
 Friday Sept 12th Continues fresh breeze heading to
 the Southward. Saw 11 Carcasses. Middle and Latter part
 fine weather. Saw R.W. Lowered & Galled came on board.
 Lowered again for more in chase at Meridian.

Latitude 47° 39' N.

Saturday Sept 13th at 2.30 P.M. Harbor boat
 struck & killed 4 P.M. took
 him to the ship and began
 to cut. 7 P.M. lashed down for the
 night. Middle and Latter part
 fine weather. Employed in cutting 10.30 finished.

Latitude 47° 48' N. Long by Chron 149° 07' E
 Sunday Sept 14th Commenced moderate breeze & foggy.
 Commenced boiling. In A.M. part light breeze. Latter
 part light breeze & smoky. Saw R.W. and lowered
 twice for them but they were not to be caught.
 Employed in boiling & setting up shoes.

Latitude 47° 40' N.

Monday Sept 15th continues the same. Saw
 R.W. lowered for them but could not hook one.
 6 A.M. took up boat. Fresh breeze through the night
 9 A.M. finished boiling. 10.30 Saw R.W. & lowered.

Latitude 47° 50' N.

Tuesday Sept 16th continues fresh breeze and
 Rugged. At 2.30 took up the boat. No fish. Middle
 and Latter part strong breeze & some rain & fog.
 Employed in Coopersing the oil to stow down.

Fog & Fog

Wednesday Sept 17th Moderate & foggy. Stowing
 down oil between decks. Middle and Latter
 part strong breeze from the South and Rainy.

Lying under short sail.

Thursday Sept 18th 1862. Continues strong breeze
 inclining to a gale. Took in all sail but closed reefed Main
 topsail. Middle part lost Waist Boat with every thing
 belonging to her. Bomb Gun. 5 lance. 2 tubs of lime.

Sail very crafty. Latter part little more moderate.
 Latitude 47° 50' N. Long by Chron 150° 25' E

Friday Sept 19th First part more moderate. At
 2 reefed J.P. sail & Spencer. Clear away J.P. staysail
 last night in the flurry. Middle and Latter part fresh
 breeze. Saw the Land a number of Islands to the S.E.

Latitude 47° 55' N. Long 151° 20' E of us

Saturday Sept 20th Continues fresh breeze and
 rugged weather heading to S.E. Middle and Latter
 part fresh breeze & Rugged. Employed in Repairing
 Store Boat. Round Island & others in sight.

Latitude 47° 45' N.

Sunday Sept 21th continues much the same.
 Middle and Latter part light breeze & Pleasant
 the Land & Pinbacks in sight. but no Whales.

Latitude 47° 40' N.

Monday Sept 22th Fine weather the first part
 of this day. Middle part fresh breeze. Steering E. S. E.
 5 A.M. Saw American and 2 or 3 other Islands. Steering
 E. S. E. Ends very light breeze the Land close to us
 on both sides. We are off the first breeze.

Latitude 47° 14' N. Long 152° 00' E

Tuesday Sept 23th Continues light air & calm.
 2 P.M. the Wind came ahead. Middle and Latter
 part moderate breeze. the Land just in sight astern.
 Now we are bound for Sandwich Islands.

Ends fresh breeze. Steering E. by South. Sat 11 P.M.
 Latitude 47° 08' N.
 Long by Chron 153° 46' E
