Saturday April 14th

This Day begins with light winds from West and pleasant weather at 2 P.M. set the studding sail. Latter parts wind and weather the same as the first. Ship under all sail. Steaming E by S. So ends. Lat by Obs 37° 15' N

Sunday April 15th

This Day begins with light winds from W. S.W. and pleasant weather. Middle and latter parts winds from S.W. and pleasant weather. Ship under all sail. Steaming E by S. So ends. The Day Lat by Obs 37° 25' N

Monday April 16th

This Day begins with light winds from S.W. and pleasant weather at 2 P.M. a sail in sight standing to the eastward. Middle and latter parts strong winds from S.W. and hazy weather. Ship under all sail. That is required by the wind So ends. Lat by Obs 37° 40' N

Tuesday April 17th

Barrrel of
Balls. This Day begins with strong gails from South and hazy weather. The watch employed in Ships Duty. Middle and latter parts winds and weather much the same as the first. Ship under all sail. That is required by the wind So ends. Lat by Obs 37° 45' N

Wednesday April 18th

This Day begins with strong winds from South and hazy weather. The watch employed in Ships Duty. Middle and latter parts strong gails and hazy. At 8 P.M. saw a boat standing to the Northward and Eastward. Ship under all sail. That is required by the wind So ends. Lat by Obs 38° 00' N

Thursday April 19th

Barrel of
Beans. This Day begins with strong gails from S.W. and hazy weather at 8 P.M. singles reefed the Top Sails. Middle and latter parts strong gails from S.W. and thick weather. Ship under single reefed Top Sails. Nothing in sight remarkable. So ends these twenty four hours. Lat by Obs 38° 15' N

Friday April 20th

Barrrel of
Bread & Pork. This Day begins with strong gails from S.W. and hazy weather at 4 P.M. saw a school of 33 black fish and a number of five black whales at 5 P.M. got out the Starboard mast Boat. Middle and latter parts light winds and pleasant. one sail in sight. Ship under all sail. Steaming S.E. So ends. Lat by Obs 38° 10' N

Saturday April 21st

This Day begins with light winds from West and pleasant weather at 3 P.M. made the Island of Fay all hazy. At 8 P.M. 3 leagues saw a number of five black whale at 8 P.M. spoke Ship Superior of 4 Pins bound to Guernsey. Middle and latter parts weather much the same as the first parts of this Day. At 10 P.M. went on shore to Fay all to get a second Ship lying off and on. one boat a shore So ends

Sunday April 22nd

Cask of
Bread. This Day begins with strong winds from West and hazy weather. At 3 P.M. the boat came from the shore but being unsuspicious did not get any thing. Middle and latter parts light winds and pleasant weather. At 12 noon saw all Pins. At 1 P.M. 10 leagues Ship under all sail. Steaming S.W. So ends this Day.
