Monday April 23^d

Sixty of

This Day begins with light winds from N.W. and pleasant weather. Saw a number of Bird Back whals. & porpoises. Middle and latter parts light winds and thick rainy weather. Ship under all sail. Nothing in sight remarkable. So ends.

Lat. 6^o 15'

Tuesday April 24th

This Day begins with light winds from S.W. and thick rainy weather. At 4 P.M. winds from N.W. set the Studdsails. Middle and latter parts light winds and squalls of rain. Ship under all sail. So ends the Day.

Lat. 6^o 37' 14"

This Day begins with light winds from S.W. and squally weather. Middle and latter parts light winds and pleasant weather. At 9 P.M. took a large stock of timber on board. Nothing in sight remarkable. The watch employed in Ship's Duty. So ends this Day.

Thursday April 26th

This Day begins with light winds from N.W. and pleasant weather. Middle and latter parts light winds and weather much the same as the first. Nothing in sight remarkable. Ship under all sail. So ends the Day.

Lat. 6^o 36' 15"

This Day begins with light winds from N.W. and pleasant weather. At 5 P.M. one sail in sight to the South. Middle and latter parts light winds and weather much the same as the first. Saw a number of Bird Back whals. So ends the Day.

Saturday April 28th

Barrel of
Mackerel.

This Day begins with light winds from N.W. and pleasant weather. At 7 P.M. set the Studdsails. Middle and latter parts strong winds from N.W. and squalls of rain. Ship under all sail steering S.S.W. Nothing in sight remarkable. The watch employed in Ship's Duty. So ends the Day by Lat. 32^o 25' N.

Sunday April 29th

This Day begins with strong winds from N.W. and pleasant weather. At 5 P.M. crossed the main Cape Gallant yard and set the Sail. Middle and latter parts strong winds and pleasant weather. Ship under all sail steering S.S.W. So ends the Day.

Lat. 29^o 52' N.

Monday April 30th

This Day begins with light winds from N.W. and pleasant weather. Middle and latter parts light winds and weather much the same as the first. Nothing in sight remarkable. Ship under all sail steering S.S.W. So ends the Day by Lat. 28^o 25' N.

Tuesday May 1st

Barrel of
Plover.

This Day begins with light winds from N.W. and pleasant weather. Middle and latter parts light winds from W.S.W. and pleasant weather. Nothing in sight remarkable. So ends the Day by Lat. 28^o 52' N.

Wednesday May 2^d

This Day begins with light winds from N.W. and pleasant weather. Middle and latter parts much the same as the first. Ship under all sail. That is required by the wind. So ends the Day by Lat. 28^o 47' N.
