Thursday May 3^d

This Day begins with light winds from N.E. and pleasant weather. The watch employed in Ship's Duty. Middle and Latter parts light winds from N.E. and pleasant weather. Steering S.W. by S. Nothing in sight remarkable. So ends this Days work. All Hands well. Lat 16. 25. 15. N.

Friday May 4th

Barrel of This Day begins with light winds from N.E. and pleasant weather. At 7 P.M. shifted over the Studdsails fore and aft. Middle and Latter parts winds from East and pleasant weather. Ship under all sail steering S.E. by N. Nothing in sight remarkable. So ends this Days work. Lat 16. 24. 05. N.

Saturday May 5th

This Day begins with light winds from E.S.E. and pleasant weather. The watch employed in ship's Duty. Middle and Latter parts strong winds and pleasant weather. Ship under all sail steering S.E. by N. Nothing in sight remarkable. So ends this Day all hands well. Lat 16. 24. 25. N.

Sunday May 6th

This Day begins with strong winds from East and pleasant weather. The watch employed in ship's Duty. Middle parts strong winds and hazy weather. Latter parts strong winds from N.E. and pleasant weather. Ship under all sail steering South. Nothing in sight remarkable. So ends this Days work all hands well. Lat 16. 19. 50. N.

Monday May 7th

This Day begins with strong winds from S.E. and pleasant weather. At 5 P.M. saw a school of Black Fish but did not lower for them. Being Sunday, Middle and Latter parts strong winds and hazy weather. At 9 A.M. made the Island of St. Antony bearing S.E. by N. Dist 5 leagues. Ship under all sail steering South. So ends this Days work.

Tuesday May 8th

Cask of This Day begins with strong winds from S.E. and hazy weather. At 7 P.M. Five Islands of St. Michael, Bone & by S. Dist 4 leagues. Middle and Latter parts winds and weather much the same as the first. At 9 A.M. made the Island of St. George bearing S. by E. Dist 5 leagues. So ends the Day.

Wednesday May 9th

This Day begins with strong winds from S.E. and pleasant weather. At 8 P.M. shifted to on the wind and by by for the night heading to the Southward and Eastward. Lying of on on through the night. Middle and Latter parts strong winds from S.E. and pleasant weather. At 5 A.M. made all sail and stood in St. S. & N. lowered the Starboard quarter Boat and went a shore. At 11 A.M. the boat came on board with a load of fruit and fuel and discharged her cargo. Then went a shore again. So ends the Days work.
