

A Journal of the Ship Margaret St. John

Friday June 8th

Sixty of This Day begins with strong winds from S.E. and squally weather and rough. Middle and Latter parts light winds and pleasant weather. At 10 A.M. crossed the Cape Gullent yards fore and aft. A number of Fin Back whale in sight. Ship under all sail that is required by the wind. So ends the Day. All hands on Board note. L.H. Obs. 22.41 S.

Saturday June 9th

This Day begins with light winds from S.E. and pleasant weather. Middle and Latter parts much the same as the first. Saw a number of Fin Back whale. Ship under all sail that is required by the wind. So ends L.H. Obs. 24.05 S.

Sunday June 10th

This Day begins with light winds from S.E. and pleasant weather. Middle and Latter parts the same. A number of Fin Back whale in sight. Ship under all sail that is required by the wind. So ends L.H. Obs. 25.03 S.

Monday June 11th

This Day begins with light winds from S.E. and pleasant weather. Middle and Latter parts the same as the first. Nothing in sight remarkable. Ship under all sail that is required by the wind. So ends this Day. L.H. Obs. 26.05 S.

Tuesday June 12th

This Day begins with light winds from S.E. and pleasant weather. Middle and Latter parts the same. Nothing in sight. So ends L.H. Obs. 26.25 South

At Brunswick, Vt. and Bound. 1832

Wednesday June 13th

This Day begins with light winds from N.E. and pleasant weather. Middle and Latter parts strong winds from N.E. and squally weather. Nothing in sight remarkable. Ship under all sail that is required by the wind. So ends. L.H. Obs. 26.48 S.

Thursday June 14th

This Day begins with strong winds from N.E. and squally weather. Middle and Latter parts winds and weather much the same as the first. At 12 or mid night. Spoke Ship Harriet of London from the Pacific Ocean with 3200 barrels of Spruce Oil Bound to London. Ship under all sail that is required by the wind. So ends L.H. Obs. 27.24 S.

Friday June 15th

Barrel of This Day begins with strong winds from N.E. and squally weather. The match employed in fitting the cutting gear. Middle and Latter parts winds the same as the first and pleasant weather. Saw a number of Fin Back whale. Ship under all sail that is required by the wind. The match employed in Ships Duty. So ends this Days work. L.H. Obs. 28.09 S.

Saturday June 16th

Cask of This Day begins with light winds from N.E. and pleasant weather. Middle and Latter parts winds and weather much the same as the first parts. Saw a number of Fin Back whale. Ship under all sail that is required by the wind. So ends this Days work. L.H. Obs. 29.20 S.
