Sunday June 17th

This Day begins with light winds from S. E. and pleasant weather. Middle and latter parts much the same as the first. Ship under all sail that is required by the wind. So ends this Day. Lat Obs 30. 18 S.

Monday June 18th

This Day begins with light winds from S. E. and pleasant weather. Middle and latter parts strong winds from S. E. and heavy weather. Nothing in sight remarkable. Ship under all sail steering East. So ends this Day. Lat Obs 29. 57 S.

Tuesday June 19th

This Day begins with strong winds from S. E. and clear weather. At 4 P.M. on board the main Top Sail and sent a new one. Middle and latter parts strong Gales from S. E. W. and thick rainy weather. Nothing in sight remarkable. Ship under all sail steering East. So ends this Day. Lat Obs 29. 57 S.

Wednesday June 20th

This Day begins with strong winds from S. W. to S. E. and squally. At 5 P.M. took in the Top Gallant sail fore and aft. Middle and latter parts strong Gales from S. E. and squally weather. At 3 A.M. double reefed the Top Sails. At 10 A.M. let out the reefs and let the main Top Gallant sail. Nothing in sight remarkable. So ends this Day's work. All hands on board well.

Barrel of. This Day begins with strong winds from S. E. and heavy weather. Middle and latter parts winds and weather much the same as the first. Nothing in sight remarkable. Ship under all sail that is required by the wind. So ends this Day's work. Long by Chron. 9. 55 W. Lat Obs 25. 49 S.

Saturday June 23^d

This Day begins with light winds from S. E. and pleasant weather. At 1 P.M. took in the Top Gallant sail fore and aft. Middle and latter parts strong Gales from S. E. and squally weather. At 12 noon took in the Top Gallant sail fore and aft. Nothing in sight remarkable. So ends this Day's work. Lat Obs 25. 59 S.

Sunday June 24th

This Day begins with strong Gales from S. E. and squally weather. Middle and latter parts much the same as the first parts. Saw a number of Fin Back whale. So ends this Day's work. Lat Obs 27. 24 S.
