Monday June 25th

This Day begins with strong Gales from S. S. E. and squally weather. Middle and Latter parts winds and weather much the same as the first till 7 A.M. sent the studsails down from of the yards. Saw a number of Fin Back whale. The watch employed in mending the Main Top Sail. So ends this Days work. Lat Obs. 28. 44 S.

Tuesday June 26th

This Day begins with strong winds from S. S. E. and squally weather. Middle and Latter parts light winds and pleasant weather. At 7 A.M. sent down the Fore Top Gallant yard and on saw the rigging the watch employed in mending the Main Top sail. Nothing in sight remarkable. So ends the Day. Lat Obs. 29. 59 S.

Wednesday June 27th

Sixty of
Crew. This Day begins with light winds from S. E. and pleasant weather. Middle and Latter parts light from N. W. and heavy weather. At 7 A.M. on sent the Fore Top mast staysail and mended it. Ship under all sail steering S. by W. Nothing in sight remarkable. So ends. Lat Obs. 30. 40 S.

Thursday June 28th

Seventy of
Crew. This Day begins with light winds from S. E. and heavy weather. At 4 P.M. sent the Fore Top mast staysail again. Middle and Latter parts light winds from N. W. and pleasant weather. Ship under all sail steering S. by W. So ends this Day. Long by Chron. 12. 13 W. Lat Obs. 32. 16 S.

Friday June 29th

Seventy of
Crew. This Day begins with strong winds from N. W. and pleasant weather. Middle and Latter parts strong winds from S. W. and squally. At 5 A.M. carried away the Main Top Sail yards. At 10 A.M. got another aloft and sent the rest. double reefed the Top Sails fore and aft. So ends the this Days work. Lat Obs.

Saturday June 30th

This Day begins with strong Gales from S. S. W. and squally weather. Middle and Latter parts much the same as the first. At 12 took in the Jib. Spraker and Main Gorse Nothing in sight. So ends the Day. Long by Chron. 09. 38 W. Lat Obs. 34. 09 S.

Sunday July 1st

This Day begins with strong Gales from S. W. and squally rain. A heavy sea on. Middle and Latter parts light winds from N. W. and heavy weather. Nothing in sight remarkable. So ends the Day. Long by Chron. 9. 13 W. Lat Obs. 34. 26 S.

Monday July 2^d

This Day begins with strong Gales from N. W. and thick heavy weather. Middle and Latter parts light winds from S. E. and pleasant. So ends the Day. Long by Chron. 09. 08 W. Lat Obs. 35. 36 S.

Tuesday July 3^d

This Day begins with light winds from S. E. and pleasant weather. Middle and Latter winds from N. W. and pleasant. At 10 A.M. saw a number of Fin Back. The watch employed in getting the cutting panels aloft. So ends. Long by Chron. 9. 52 W. Lat Obs. 36. 08 S. with
