

A Journal of the Ship Margaret St. John N. B.

Wednesday August 1st

This Day begins with light winds from South and pleasant weather. Middle and Latter parts much the same as the first. At 2 A.M. finished boiling etc. 9 A.M. lowered the boats and pulled in, to the land ran two mile but could not strike. So ends the boat chase.

Thursday August 2^d

This Day begins with light winds from S.E. and pleasant. At 6 A.M. the boats came on board with nothing. Middle and Latter parts winds from N.E. and pleasant. At 9 A.M. lowered the boats and pulled in. At 11 A.M. struck one whale, and killed her. At 12 took her to the ship, one ship in sight. So ends.

Friday August 3^d

Barnab. This Day begins with light winds from N.W. and heavy weather. At 2 A.M. commenced cutting etc. 8 A.M. finished. At 10 A.M. got the first whale ready for boiling. Middle and Latter parts winds and weather much the same as the first. One sail in sight employed in boiling. So ends. Ends Day's work.

Saturday August 4th

Barnab. This Day begins with light winds from N.W. and pleasant weather. Middle and Latter parts strong winds from N.W. and heavy weather. One sail in sight employed in boiling. So ends the Day.

Sunday August 5th

Sixty of Corn. This Day begins with strong winds from N.W. and heavy weather. At 10 A.M. finished boiling. Middle and Latter parts strong Gale and thick rainy weather. Nothing in sight remarkable. So ends.

Monday August 6th

Cash of. This Day begins with strong Gale from N.W. and thick rainy weather. Middle and Latter parts strong winds and heavy weather. Nothing in sight remarkable employed in stowing down etc. So ends.

Tuesday August 7th

This Day begins with strong winds from N.W. and heavy weather. At 4 A.M. finished stowing down etc. Middle and Latter parts light winds from S.W. and thick rainy weather. So ends the Day's work.

Wednesday August 8th

This Day begins with light winds from S.W. and heavy weather. Middle and Latter parts strong winds from S.W. and pleasant weather. At 9 A.M. lowered the boats, and pulled in to the land. One ship in sight boiling. So ends.

Thursday August 9th

Barnab. This Day begins with strong winds from N.E. and heavy weather. At 6 A.M. the boats came on board with nothing. Latter parts strong Gale from N.W. and thick rainy weather. Nothing in sight. So ends.

Friday August 10th

This Day begins with strong Gale from N.W. and thick heavy weather. Latter parts the same as the first. One ship in sight. So ends lying to in a Gale of wind.

Saturday August 11th

This Day begins with strong Gale from N.W. and heavy weather. Latter parts the same as the first. One sail in sight. So ends lying to in a heavy Gale of wind.
