Wednesday August 22^d

Sixty of This Day begins with light winds from N.W. and pleasant weather. Latter part much the same as the first. Two sail in sight. So ends the watch employed in mending sail.

Thursday August 23^d

Cook of This Day begins with light winds from N.W. and pleasant weather. Latter part much the same as the first. At 9 A.M. lowered the boat and pored in to the land saw several whales could not strike at 11 A.M. spoke Ship Election of N. in London one whale spoke Ship Tipton of N. in Bridport one whale spoke a French Ship from Brest since N. B. So ends this Day's watch.

Friday August 24th

This Day begins with light winds from N.W. and pleasant weather. At 4 P.M. the boat came on board. Latter part, wind and weather, the same as the first. At 9 A.M. lowered the boat and pored in to the land saw nothing. Three sail in sight. So ends the Day.

Saturday August 25th

This Day begins with strong winds from S.W. and thick cloudy weather. At 4 P.M. the boat came on board. Latter part strong Gale from S.W. and thick weather. Four sail in sight. So ends.

Sunday August 26th

This Day begins with strong Gale from S.W. and thick weather. At 1 P.M. spoke Ship Election of N. in London 120 lbs of sperm Oil. Latter part light winds and pleasant weather. One sail in sight. So ends this Day.

Continuing from the Christian Island. 1832.

Monday August 27th

This Day begins with strong Gale from N.W. and thick cloudy weather. Latter part the same. So ends.

Tuesday August 28th

This Day begins with strong Gale from N.W. and thick weather. Latter part the same. So ends.

Wednesday August 29th

This Day begins with strong Gale from N.W. and thick weather. Latter part the same. So ends.

Thursday August 30th

This Day begins with strong Gale from S.W. and cloudy weather. Latter part strong Gale from South and cloudy weather. Five sail in sight. So ends.

Friday August 31st

This Day begins with strong Gale from South and cloudy weather. Latter part strong Gale from S.W. and thick weather. Five sail in sight. So ends.

Saturday September 1st

This Day begins with strong Gale from S.W. and cloudy weather. Latter part more moderate, eight sail in sight. The watch employed in mending sails. So ends.

Sunday September 2^d

This Day begins with fresh Gale from S.W. and cloudy weather. At 6 P.M. spoke Ship Election of N. in London. Five whale. Latter part light breezes from S.W. and pleasant weather. At 10 A.M. saw one whale going to the northeast very quick. Two sail in sight. So ends this Day.
