Monday September 3^d

Sixty of This Day begins with light breeze from S. S. E. and pleasant weather. At 2 P. M. the boat and pulled in to the land saw a number of white whale but could not get fast. At 4 P. M. the boat came on board. Latter part winds and weather much the same as the first. At 7 P. M. lowered the boat and pulled in saw nothing. At 10 P. M. the boat came on board. At 11 P. M. spoke Ship Bay of Boston one whale. Caution said in sight So ends

Tuesday September 4th

This Day begins with light winds from S. S. E. and pleasant weather. Latter part much the same as the first. At 4 P. M. lowered the boat and pulled in to the land saw nothing. At 11 P. M. came on board. none said in sight. So ends this Days work.

Wednesday September 5th

Cash of This Day begins with strong Gale from N. W. and cloudy weather. At 6 P. M. saw a white whale lowered for him but could not get him. Latter part strong Gale from N. W. and thick weather. So ends.

Thursday September 6th

Board of This Day begins with strong Gale from N. W. and thick cloudy weather. Latter part the same So ends

Friday September 7th

This Day begins with light winds from S. W. and thick weather. Latter part fresh Gale from W. and clear weather. At 3 P. M. lowered the boat and pulled in saw nothing. At 8 P. M. the boat came on board. One said in sight. So ends this Day.

Cruising Round the Bristol Islands 1832

Saturday September 8th

This Day begins with fresh Gale from West and cloudy weather. saw a number of whale. Could not strike. At 5 P. M. spoke Ship Main of Fair Haven no Oil. Latter part winds and weather much the same as the first. Nothing in sight remarkable So ends.

Sunday September 9th

This Day begins with fresh Gale from S. W. and squally weather. Latter part much the same as the first. One said in sight. So ends.

Monday September 10th

This Day begins with strong Gale from N. W. and thick weather. At 7 P. M. the Fore Top mast staysail blown away. At 8 P. M. took in the Main Top Sail. Latter part heavy Gale from N. W. and thick weather. At 4 P. M. up the main Top Sail. So ends.

Tuesday September 11th

This Day begins with a heavy Gale from West and thick weather. Latter part more moderate. At 10 P. M. saw a dead whale. At 11 P. M. took him along side. One said in sight. So ends.

Wednesday September 12th

This Day begins with light winds from S. S. E. and squalls of rain. At 1 P. M. began to cut. At 7 P. M. finished lost the throat one leg and a piece of the small. At 11 P. M. began to hail. Latter part winds and weather much the same as the first. At 10 P. M. saw two whale lowered for them, but got neither of them. Two said in sight. So ends.
